№ IN THE LORD'S HOUSE TODAY №

WELCOME! We are happy that you are worshipping with us. As Psalm 122:1 says, "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!'" ★ THE WORD FOR TODAY ★

 $ST.\ JAMES\ OF\ JERUSALEM,\ BROTHER\ OF\ JESUS\ AND\ MARTYR$

"A prophet is not without honor except in His hometown and in His own household" (Matt. 13:58). James the Just was once offended at Jesus' wisdom and mighty works. But he came to faith following His resurrection, when Jesus appeared to him (1 Cor. 15:7). He then became a leader of the early Church in Jerusalem, present at the council recorded in Acts 15. There James recognized from the prophets that Jesus was the Lord known from of old and returned to rebuild David's fallen tent and restore it, that the remnant of mankind may seek the Lord and all the Gentiles who are called by My Name (Acts 15:16–18). "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness" (James 1:2–3). Josephus and other historians record that James was martyred by stoning in the 60s AD. "Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him" (v. 12).

▼ THE MUSIC FOR TODAY ▼

In the hymn *Praise the Almighty*, John Daniel Herrnschmidt (1675–1723) provides a beautiful summary of Psalm 146, which speaks of God as the true ground of faith because of all his merciful works towards us. In our readings today we hear of James who did not believe in his brother Jesus until after the resurrection (1 Cor. 15:7). In Acts 15 we read that even the Gentiles would be saved. This brings us back to Psalm 146:7-9 where we see a list of the oppressed that Jesus protects (the faithful, the just, the bowed down, the righteous, etc.).

№ PREPARING FOR WORSHIP

- *PREPARE* to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- REFLECT on Psalm 133 in the front part of Lutheran Service Book.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 797, "Praise the Almighty"

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. Guests are asked to speak with the pastor prior to communing. Those who have a health concern with the alcohol in the cup are asked to speak with the pastor. If you are taking Communion, please fill out the attendance card by marking an "X" in the box by the names of those communing, and hand the card to an usher as you go to the Lord's Table.
