★ THE WORD FOR TODAY ★

JOHN THE BAPTIZER PREPARES THE WAY FOR THE LORD

The voice of the Baptizer cried out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord..." (Isa. 40:1). John called the people to be made ready for the Messiah's coming through repentance, for "all flesh is grass" (Isa. 40:6). Now He asks from prison, "Are you the one who is to come...?" (Matt. 11:2). Jesus' works bear witness that He is. The sick are made well; the dead are raised, and the poor have the Gospel preached to them. Their iniquity is pardoned; they have received from the Lord's hand double forgiveness for all their sins. The "stewards of the mysteries of God" (1 Cor. 4:1) still deliver Christ's overflowing forgiveness to the poor in spirit, comforting God's people with the word of the Gospel which stands forever. This Gospel produces rejoicing among all those who believe.

★ THE MUSIC FOR TODAY ★

HARK! A THRILLING VOICE IS SOUNDING (LSB 345)

Although earliest manuscript copy dates from the tenth century, this text is possibly as old as the fifth century. It is based on the Latin hymn *Vox clara ecce intonat* and its 1632 revision *En clara vox redarguit*. The text in the Psalter Hymnal is a revision of both Edward Caswall's (PHH 438) translation in his Lyra Catholica (1849) and the translation in Hymns Ancient and Modern (1861). Stanzas 1-3 contain references to Christ's first coming, but stanza 4 surely refers to the second coming, and stanza 5, the only stanza addressed to God, is a doxology. William H. Monk composed MERTON and published it in *The Parish Choir* (1850). The tune has been associated with this text since the 1861 edition of *Hymns Ancient and Modern*. The tune's title is thought to refer to Walter de Merton, founder of Merton College, Oxford, England.

- REFLECT on Psalm 85 in the front part of Lutheran Service Book.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 345, "Hark! A Thrilling Voice is Sounding"

TAXPAYERS TO THE STATE OF MISSOURI—both individuals and businesses—now have the unique opportunity to direct up to 50% of their state taxes to provide scholarships for qualifying children to attend a Lutheran school. The Missouri State Treasurer's Office launched a new tax credit program called MOScholars. The program allows organizations like the Missouri District to convert these tax dollars into scholarships for qualifying students attending LCMS schools. By pre-paying up to fifty percent of your state tax liability that you will have to pay regardless, you are able to help provide Christian education for children. To date, taxpayers have worked with the District through MOScholars to provide scholarships for 23 students to attend Lutheran schools. There are currently 65 additional students awaiting scholarships for this school year. The deadline for helping these students is December 31. Directing taxes to Lutheran education through this program is as simple as completing an online form and pre-paying a portion of state taxes in the amount of the credit reservation.
