#### **№ IN THE LORD'S HOUSE TODAY**

#### **★ THE WORD FOR TODAY ★**

THE LIVING AND LIFE-GIVING WORD OF GOD DWELLS AMONG US IN THE FLESH

In the beginning God created all things through His Word, His Son. But man fell into sin, and with man all creation was cursed. Therefore, God spoke His Word again, this time into the womb of the blessed Virgin Mary. The glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle of our human nature (Ex. 40:17–21,34–38). "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:1–14). The Son of God took on our flesh and blood and died on the cross in order that we might receive the right to become the children of God through faith. Baptized into Christ's body, we are made partakers of a new Genesis, "the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit" (Titus 3:4–7). In Christ, the kindness and love of God our Savior toward man has truly appeared.

#### \* THE MUSIC FOR TODAY \*

WE PRAISE YOU, JESUS, AT YOUR BIRTH (LSB 382)

In the late Middle Ages, just before the Reformation, the experience of ordinary Christians was quite different from today. They knew that they were supposed to go to worship and that holy things happened there, but most of the service was sung or spoken in Latin, not in the language of the people. While many of the words were the same as we use in the liturgy today, many worshipers could not understand them. At that time, there were just three German songs that were allowed to be sung by the people in worship. At Easter they could sing "Christ Is Arisen" (LSB 459). At Pentecost they were allowed to sing a verse that later expanded into "To God the Holy Spirit Let Us Pray" (768). And at Christmas they sang a verse that eventually became the first stanza of this hymn. This verse was sung right before the reading of the Christmas Gospel. Martin Luther used this popular religious song and the other six stanzas. It was likely sung for the first time in 1523. "We Praise You, Jesus, at Your Birth" thus became the first Christmas song of the Reformation, and began the Protestant heritage of Christmas songs and carols. (from *The Word in Song*)

#### **▼ PREPARING FOR WORSHIP ▼**

- *PREPARE* to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- *REFLECT* on Psalm 2 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 378, "Break Forth, O Beauteous Heavenly Light"

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. If you are taking Communion, please fill out the attendance card by marking an "X" in the box by the names of those communing, and hand the card to an usher as you go to the Lord's Table.

CIRCUMCISION & NAME OF JESUS (January 1, 2023)

Old Testament: Numbers 6:22-27 — The LORD gives His benediction to Aaron in order to put His

name on His people.

Psalm: Psalm 8 — "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth." Epistle: Galatians 3:23-29 — In Christ we are sons of God through faith in Him. Luke 2:21 — Our Lord is circumcised and given the name "Jesus."

TAXPAYERS TO THE STATE OF MISSOURI—both individuals and businesses—now have the unique opportunity to direct up to 50% of their state taxes to provide scholarships for qualifying children to attend a Lutheran school. The Missouri State Treasurer's Office launched a new tax credit program called MOScholars. The program allows organizations like the Missouri District to convert these tax dollars into scholarships for qualifying students attending LCMS schools. By pre-paying up to fifty percent of your state tax liability that you will have to pay regardless, you are able to help provide Christian education for children. To date, taxpayers have worked with the District through MOScholars to provide scholarships for 23 students to attend Lutheran schools. There are currently 65 additional students awaiting scholarships for this school year. The deadline for helping these students is December 31. Directing taxes to Lutheran education through this program is as simple as completing an online form and pre-paying a portion of state taxes in the amount of the credit reservation.
