THOSE WHO WAIT ON THE LORD SHALL REJOICE

The people of God are pilgrims and sojourners in this world, looking ahead to a destination yet to come (1 Peter 2:11–20). Though we are now children of God, the fullness of what we shall be has not yet been revealed (1 John 3:1–3). We are those who wait on the Lord. "The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him" (Lam. 3:25). Jesus tells us that the wait is just a little while. "A little while, and you will see me no longer; and again a little while, and you will see me" (John 16:16). Though you must experience sorrow for a time, though you must live as strangers in a world that is at enmity with Christ, yet your sorrow will be turned to joy when He returns. "But they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength" (Is. 40:31). The little while of weeping shall be replaced with an eternity of rejoicing in the presence of Christ the crucified and risen Savior. "And no one will take your joy from you" (John 16:22).

WITH HIGH DELIGHT LET US UNITE (LSB 483)

The hymn of the day for Jubilate Sunday is indeed filled with joy and makes the heart happy to sing. The tune by Martin Franzmann matches the text written by the Moravian Georg Vetter, which was written some fifty or so years after the Reformation. Its confession of faith proves a zeal for evangelism is not unique to our age. Rather happiness in the task is especially seen in those followers who came after Jon Hus. The hymn shows the great importance the Moravians held in having both pastors and people joining together in proclaiming the resurrection of Christ. The hymn embodies this even in its opening phrase, "With high delight let us unite in songs of great jubilation." Primarily a commentary on the words of Mark 16:15, "And he said to them, 'Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation,'" our hymn contains phrases such as: "To all earth's ends," "every nation, every land," and again "every nation." Whatever suffering and hardships come to the followers of Jesus, "With high delight" impresses on the hearts and minds of all who sing it that the Gospel grants our work to be a task in which we can continually rejoice, letting praises ring, giving thanks as we sing forth Christ's victory and "death's undoing."
