▼ IN THE LORD'S HOUSE TODAY ▼

WELCOME! We are happy that you are worshipping with us. As Psalm 122:1 says, "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!'" Here in the Lord's House our Lord Jesus Christ is truly present in His Word and Sacrament to give us His gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation. ★ THE WORD FOR TODAY ★

THE LORD LIFTS UP THE LOWLY

"And the Lord had regard for Abel and his offering, but for Cain and his offering he had no regard" (Gen. 4:1–15). For unlike Abel, Cain's offering did not proceed from a heart that revered and trusted in the Lord. Thus, the lowly tax collector who prayed, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" was the one who went down to his house justified before God, not the respectable, outwardly righteous Pharisee who trusted in himself and his own good living (Luke 18:9–14). "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Eph. 2:1–10). The one who penitently despairs of his own righteousness and relies completely on the atoning mercy of God in Christ is the one who is declared righteous. For Christ died for our sins and rose again the third day (1 Cor. 15:1–10). Therefore, "everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

★ THE MUSIC FOR TODAY ★

OH, HOW GREAT IS YOUR COMPASSION (LSB 559). This text, dripping with the Gospel and reminders that we are saved through Christ's merit, was written by Johannes Olearius and translated into English by August Crull. Olearius (1617-1684) was the first in a long line of German Lutheran theologians. In musical circles, he is probably best known for two things. First, he assembled his *Geistliche Singe-Knust* in 1671, a seven-volume collection of 1,200+ hymns. A prolific poet, his hymns reflect the orthodoxy of Martin Luther. Secondly, he is well-known for his commentary on the entire Bible, published in 1681 in Leipzig, Germany. It is from his commentary and other devotional works that Johann Sebastian Bach found the texts for a number of his cantatas. Other well-known hymns by Olearius include: *Comfort, Comfort, Ye My People (LSB 347)* and *The Lord, My God, Be Praised (LSB 794)*.

♥ PREPARING FOR WORSHIP ♥

- *PREPARE* to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- *REFLECT* on Psalm 50 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 559, "Oh, How Great is Your Compassion."

THE TWELFTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY (August 27, 2023) -

Old Testament: **Isaiah 29:17-24**—God restores His humbled people Israel. Psalm: **Psalm 146**—"Praise the LORD! Praise the LORD, O my soul!"

Epistle: **2 Corinthians 3:4-11** – We are not sufficient of ourselves, but our sufficiency comes

from Christ.

Holy Gospel: Luke 18:9-14 – God justifies (saves; forgives) not the self-righteous Pharisee, but the

humble, confessing tax-collector.
