THE LORD JESUS COMES IN HUMILITY TO REDEEM US

The new Church Year begins by focusing on the humble coming of our Lord. "Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey" (Matt. 21:5). Even as He was born in a lowly manger, so Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a beast of burden. For He bears the sin of the world. He is the Son of David riding to His enthronement on the cross, where He shows Himself to be "The LORD is our Righteousness" (Jer. 23:5–6). Our Lord still comes in great humility to deliver His righteousness to us in the Word and Sacraments. Before receiving Christ's body and blood, we also sing, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" (Matt. 21:9) And as we receive the Sacrament, we set our hearts on His return in glory, for "our salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed" (Rom. 13:11).

Happy New Year! Today we welcome the new church year, and the beginning of Advent. We hear of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on the first Palm Sunday, foreshadowing his second Triumphant Entry when he returns on the last day. Our Hymn of the Day, *Savior of the Nations, Come (LSB 332)* was written by Ambrose of Milan (the father of Latin hymnody). Ambrose's hymns are characterized by their simplicity and were written for congregational use. The tune NUN KOMM, DER HEIDEN HEILAND, is adapted from a plainsong melody that accompanied the original Latin text.

№ PREPARING FOR WORSHIP

- *PREPARE* to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- *REFLECT* on Psalm 24 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 332, "Savior of the Nations, Come"

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. Guests are asked to speak with the pastor prior to communing. Those who have a health concern with the alcohol in the cup are asked to speak with the pastor. If you are taking Communion, please fill out the attendance card by marking an "X" in the box by the names of those communing, and hand the card to an usher as you go to the Lord's Table.

NEW ADVENT BANNERS AND WHAT THEY MEAN: Our new blue banners point to Jesus as the coming King. The Root of Jesse banner, with a live shoot arising from the root, comes from Isaiah 11:10, "In that day the root of Jesse, who shall stand as a signal for the peoples — of him shall the nations inquire, and his resting place shall be glorious." Jesus descended from the line of Jesse and his son, David. In the second banner the door is partially open to reveal the Chi Rho (XP) symbol with a crown for the coming King. Jesus said, "I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture" (John 10:9). The Chi Rho symbol is taken from the first two letters of the Greek word " \underline{Chr} istos" $-\underline{XP}$ I Σ TO Σ .
