▼ THE WORD FOR TODAY ▼

JOHN THE BAPTIZER PREPARES THE WAY FOR THE LORD

The voice of the Baptizer cried out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord..." (Isa. 40:1). John called the people to be made ready for the Messiah's coming through repentance, for "all flesh is grass" (Isa. 40:6). Now He asks from prison, "Are you the one who is to come...?" (Matt. 11:2). Jesus' works bear witness that He is. The sick are made well; the dead are raised, and the poor have the Gospel preached to them. Their iniquity is pardoned; they have received from the Lord's hand double forgiveness for all their sins. The "stewards of the mysteries of God" (1 Cor. 4:1) still deliver Christ's overflowing forgiveness to the poor in spirit, comforting God's people with the word of the Gospel which stands forever. This Gospel produces rejoicing among all those who believe.

★ THE MUSIC FOR TODAY ★

ALL YOU WORKS OF GOD, BLESS THE LORD (LSB 930)

What an odd hymn to sing on the Third Sunday of Advent! Today happens to also be the commemoration of "Daniel the Prophet and Three Young Men." Steven Starke paraphrases their song, commonly titled *Benedicite Opera*, in this juxtaposition with an upbeat Jamaican tune. The text is commonly heard at Hope as the final canticle of the Easter Vigil service and is contained in the Apocrypha. Though not found in the original Hebrew of Daniel chapter 2, Dr. Martin Luther writes, "...to keep them [various prayers and writings] from perishing, we have put them here [the Apocrypha] in a kind of special little spice garden or flower bed since much that is good, especially the hymn of praise, *Benedicte [Opera]*, is to be found in them." Enjoy a spicy little hymn of praise!

- *PREPARE* to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- *REFLECT* on Psalm 85 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 345, "Hark! A Thrilling Voice is Sounding"

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. Guests are asked to speak with the pastor prior to communing. Those who have a health concern with the alcohol in the cup are asked to speak with the pastor. If you are taking Communion, please fill out the attendance card by marking an "X" in the box by the names of those communing, and hand the card to an usher as you go to the Lord's Table.

NEW ADVENT BANNERS AND WHAT THEY MEAN: Our new blue banners point to Jesus as the coming King. The Root of Jesse banner, with a live shoot arising from the root, comes from Isaiah 11:10, "In that day the root of Jesse, who shall stand as a signal for the peoples – of him shall the nations inquire, and his resting place shall be glorious." Jesus descended from the line of Jesse and his son, David. In the second banner the door is partially open to reveal the Chi Rho (XP) symbol with a crown for the coming King. Jesus said, "I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture" (John 10:9). The Chi Rho symbol is taken from the first two letters of the Greek word " \underline{Chr} istos" $-\underline{XP}$ I Σ TO Σ .
