THE SEED OF DAVID COMES TO HIS TEMPLE

A Rod has come forth from the stem of Jesse (Is. 11:1–5)—the Seed of David whose kingdom shall be established forever (2 Sam. 7:1–16). In the fullness of time, God sent forth His Son Jesus to redeem us from the judgment of the Law (Gal. 4:1–7). Now He is presented in the temple in fulfillment of the Law and revealed to be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel" (Luke 2:22–40). Christ has enlightened us in baptism, giving us to be adopted as sons of God and heirs of eternal life. Receiving the Holy Sacrament of His body and blood, we are prepared to depart this world in peace, for our eyes have seen the salvation of God in Him.

▼ THE MUSIC FOR TODAY ▼

The carol *Angels from the Realms of Glory* was written by Moravian James Montgomery. Montgomery had a sorted career in publishing, as a clergyman, and poet. This carol made its debut in 1816 and was commonly sung to a French tune. In the U.S. the common tune for this carol is *Regent Square* composed by Henry Smart. Smart was responsible for cultivating wonderful congregational singing in the churches he served in London even though he was blind. This tune was composed for a Presbyterian hymnal called *Psalms and Hymns for Divine Worship*.

- *PREPARE* to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- *REFLECT* on Psalm 89 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 389, "Let All Together Praise Our God."

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. Guests are asked to speak with the pastor prior to communing. Those who have a health concern with the alcohol in the cup are asked to speak with the pastor. If you are taking Communion, please fill out the attendance card by marking an "X" in the box by the names of those communing, and hand the card to an usher as you go to the Lord's Table.

▼ SCRIPTURE READINGS TO PREPARE FOR NEXT SUNDAY

THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD- Jesus is baptized to fulfill all righteousness – in our place (January 7, 2024):

Old Testament: **Joshua 3:1-3, 7-8, 13-17**—Israel crosses the Jordan and enters the Promised Land. Psalm: **Psalm 45**—"My heart is overflowing with a good theme; I recite my composition

concerning the King."

Epistle: 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 – Christ is our righteousness, our sanctification, and our

redemption.

Holy Gospel: Matthew 3:13-17 – Jesus is baptized to fulfill all righteousness for us.

NEW CHRISTMAS BANNERS AND THEIR MEANING: Jesus is the Rose of Sharon (Song of Solomon 2:1) which is the same Hebrew word used in Isaiah 35:1, "The wilderness and the solitary place shall be glad for them; and the desert shall rejoice, and blossom as the rose." In this passage the Lord prepares salvation for His exiled people, reminding us of how He has prepared eternal salvation for all people through Christ's Incarnation (Chi Rho, XP) as a baby in a manger. The five petals of the rose also remind us of the five wounds on Christ's hands, feet, and side during His crucifixion.
