№ IN THE LORD'S HOUSE TODAY

WELCOME! We are happy that you are worshipping with us. As Psalm 122:1 says, "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!'" Here in the Lord's House our Lord Jesus Christ is truly present in His Word and Sacrament to give us His gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation. The Sunday Divine Service is also being live-streamed on Hope's <u>Facebook page</u> and the service folder (bulletin) may be <u>accessed here</u>. "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 136:1).

★ THE WORD FOR TODAY ★

The coming of the Messianic kingdom means the restoration of creation. The sign of this restoration is that "the mountains shall drip sweet wine" (Amos 9:11–15). When the elements of a fallen creation fail and run short at a wedding feast, our Lord Jesus steps in to restore creation and miraculously changes water into an abundance of the very best wine (John 2:1–11). With this sign, Christ manifests His glory. The "back" of God (Ex. 33:12–23) is revealed to those who believe. The hour will come when Jesus will again manifest His glory by taking creation's curse into His own body to release us from its power. The Bridegroom will give His life for the Bride (Eph. 5:22–32), and from His side will flow water and blood, the holy sacraments by which she is cleansed and made one with Him. Through this sacrificial love of Christ we are enabled to "love one another with brotherly affection . . ." and to "outdo one another in showing honor" (Rom. 12:6–16).

▼ THE MUSIC FOR TODAY ▼

Our Hymn of the Day today, *The Only Son from Heaven (LSB* 402), has an interesting background. The following is taken from "The Word in Song: Hymn of the Day Studies," available at lcms.org. "This hymn holds many distinctions. It is one of the earliest Lutheran hymns, as it was written around 1524, right about the time that Martin Luther began in earnest to revive the hymnody of the Church. Hymns from that period are well known for being substantive, and this one is no exception. The author of our hymn was Elisabeth (Meseritz) Cruciger (1500–1535), an ex-nun from Rega who married

a theologian named Caspar Cruciger in 1524. She and her husband became close friends of Martin and Katherine Luther and could often be found around the Luther dinner table. Given her age and the times in which she lived, it is nothing short of amazing that Luther and his colleague, Kantor Johann Walter, approved this text for the earliest Lutheran hymnals. The hymn was not included in *The Lutheran Hymnal* of 1941, but was reintroduced in the Missouri Synod with its inclusion in *Lutheran Worship* in 1982. It has slowly but steadily gained acceptance and popularity in our circles since that time."

- PREPARE to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of Lutheran Service Book.
- *REFLECT* on Psalm 67 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 402, "The Only Son from Heaven"

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. NEW EPIPHANY BANNERS AND THEIR MEANING: In the northern hemisphere, we give thanks for the increasing daylight during this time of year just as we give thanks for the Light of Christ during the Epiphany season. The *Star* banner reminds us that Christ is "A light to lighten the Gentiles" (Luke 2:32). The *Crown and Scepter* banner reminds us of the Gentile Magi from the East who studied and believed the prophetic Scriptures and came to worship the "King of the Jews" (Matthew 2:2).
