№ IN THE LORD'S HOUSE TODAY

WELCOME! We are happy that you are worshipping with us. As Psalm 122:1 says, "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!'" Here in the Lord's House our Lord Jesus Christ is truly present in His Word and Sacrament to give us His gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation. ▼ THE WORD FOR TODAY ▼

GRACE ALONE

The people of Israel contended with the Lord in the wilderness (Ex. 17:1–7). They were dissatisfied with His provision. In the same way, the first laborers in the vineyard complained against the landowner for the wage he provided them (Matt. 20:1–16). They charged him with being unfair, but in reality he was being generous. For the Lord does not wish to deal with us on the basis of what we deserve but on the basis of His abounding grace in Christ. The first—those who rely on their own merits—will be last. "For they were overthrown in the wilderness" (1 Cor. 10:5). But the last, those who rely on Christ, will be first. For Christ is the Rock (1 Cor. 9:24–10:5). He is the One who was struck and from whose side blood and water flowed that we may be cleansed of our sin.

▼ THE MUSIC FOR TODAY ▼

The hymn *Hark, the Voice of Jesus Crying (LSB 826)* is well-known and loved within many LCMS congregations. However, its text by Daniel March is law oriented. This focus on the law even lead to its recommendation to be excluded from the *Lutheran Book of Worship* in 1978. To address these concerns and retain a much-loved tune, the *Lutheran Service Book* hymnal committee approached Stephen Starke to pen new gospel focused stanzas. Rather than combine the two texts and create a long-winded hymn, they replaced the original first stanza with Starke's new stanzas, giving birth to our Hymn of the Day for Septuagesima, *Hark, the Voice of Jesus Calling (LSB 827)*. Stanza one, with its altering of "crying" to "calling" to avoid the confusion of having two hymns with the same title, is a paraphrase of Matthew 20 (today's Gospel). Stanza two paints a picture of workers joining the harvest throughout the day. Jesus' disciples joined in the spreading of the Gospel right away and many generations of the Church have labored throughout history. Today, as the harvest is getting ripe, His church is still laboring to bring in the final harvest. In stanza three we sing of God's Word growing faith in the heart and the final stanza encourages the Church to listen to His voice as we long for, "the time [when] work shall cease," and we "shall enjoy His Sabbath peace."

▼ PREPARING FOR WORSHIP ▼

- *PREPARE* to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- *REFLECT* on Psalm 95 in the front part of *Lutheran Service Book*.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 827, "Hark, the Voice of Jesus Calling"

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation.
