★ THE WORD FOR TODAY ★

JESUS IS OUR REDEMPTION

In the temple Jesus said, "If anyone keeps my word, he will never see death" (John 8:51). For Jesus came to taste death for us—to drink the cup of suffering to the dregs in order that we might be released from its power. Clinging to His life-giving words, we are delivered from death's sting and its eternal judgment. Christ is our High Priest, who entered the Most Holy Place and with His own blood obtained everlasting redemption for His people (Heb. 9:11-15). He is the One who was before Abraham was, and yet is his descendant. He is the promised Son who carries the wood up the mountain for the sacrifice, who is bound and laid upon the altar of the cross. He is the ram who is offered in our place, who is willingly caught in the thicket of our sin, and who wears the crown of thorns upon His head (Gen. 22:1-14). Though Jesus is dishonored by the sons of the devil, He is vindicated by the Father through the cross.

MY SONG IS LOVE UNKNOWN - LSB 430

What kind of love does the Father have for us? He sent His Son to die so we would be called children of God (1 John 3:1). This love no one born from Adam can fully understand. This love we know only as we ponder what Jesus Christ has done for us, especially His death in the place of sinners. To defeat the devil for sinners, He is exchanged for a murderer (Barabbas). Christ, the Suffering Servant (Isaiah 52–53), came from heaven for this purpose: to die the death of sinners and to be buried in our place. Because He died this death, all Christians rejoice and sing praises since we shall be taken to dwell with our saving God in heaven. Thus we sing of God's love for us in Christ, now and forevermore. - PREPARE to receive the Lord's Supper by reviewing "Christian Questions and Their Answers" beginning on 329 in the front part of Lutheran Service Book.
- REFLECT on Psalm 43 in the front part of Lutheran Service Book.
- PONDER today's Hymn of the Day, LSB 430, "My Song is Love Unknown"

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated at each Sunday morning Divine Service, with both chalice and individual cup offered. Members of congregations of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod may partake of the Sacrament trusting that in this Holy Meal the Lord Jesus Christ is present and gives His Body and Blood for our forgiveness, life, and salvation. NEW PASSIONTIDE-GOOD FRIDAY BANNERS AND THEIR MEANING: The stark colors remind us of the depth of our sin (black) and Christ's righteousness (white) which entirely covers that sin. The cross and nails reveal how Jesus suffered to save us from sin and death. The crown of thorns and the crown on the cross reveal the paradox that Jesus's shame and suffering are the glory of God and our salvation. "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified" (John 12:23). As we enter Passiontide and journey toward Good Friday, let us fix our eyes on our crucified Lord and His love for us, which won our salvation.

STEWARDSHIP BLURB FOR SUNDAY, MARCH 17: Genesis 22:2 – "He said, 'Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." It's hard for us to even fathom a faith as strong as Abraham's – he follows the Lord's Word even when it seems impossibly hard. But he does so because he knows that the Lord only means to bless. What happened here to Abraham should be an encouragement for us: trust the Lord and keep His Word.
