Let the Sun Shine In

If you enjoy the music of the 1960s and 1970s, then just the sight of the title of this newsletter article evokes The 5th Dimension's melody flowing through your brain. It was a repetitive bidding that was medlied with the song Aquarius. "Let the sun shine in, let the sun shine in" over and over is about all of the song we got. It was cheery and melodic, and a song that would stick with you for the rest of the day.

The original song by Galt MacDermont was less than cheery, but it paints a fuller picture of the desire to have the sun shine in. This song starts dark and broken with a view of the world that is far less than cheery. It seems to describe well a broken planet into which one would want some sun to shine in. In an interview with *American Songwriter*, Florence LaRue of The 5th Dimension was asked why they recorded this song. She said because it was uplifting. LaRue states, "As a matter of fact now, when we sing "Let The Sunshine In"- I think not only of let the s-u-n shine, but let the S-o-n shine (*American Songwriter*,1).

I must admit to you that I have never thought so deeply about this 5th Dimension song, but it wouldn't take us long, as LaRue suggests, to turn this popular song into a prayer: "O Lord, I thank you for the day that you give me, and no matter what happens this day, let your Son shine brightly into my life. Amen."

He does! One of my favorite descriptions of Jesus comes from Revelation chapter 1. "In His right hand He held seven stars, from His mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and His face was like the sun shining in full strength (Revelation 1:16)." Look at what God gives us here. Jesus holding His

people in the care of His hand, speaking His Word, and His face in full strength brightness.

2 Corinthians 4:6 says, "For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." We get the knowledge of God in the face of Jesus, but how do we get the face of Jesus? That is to ask, "How does the Son shine in?" By His sharp two-edged sword piercing the darkness. Open Bible, bright light, face of Jesus, glory of God. You get it all. On your bright days and your dark days, we pray "O Lord, let your Son shine in."


That word is on you. It is in you. The Lord puts His name on you by that word as you receive the Blessing each and every week:

The Lord bless and keep you;

The Lord make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you;

The Lord lift His countenance upon you and give you His peace (Numbers 6:24-26).

However, have you ever read verse 27? "So shall they put my name upon the people of Israel, and I will bless them."



You leave church each Sunday with this firm word of God cast upon you in blessed fashion. God's name on you, you live with His face shining upon you.

O, Lord, let your Son shine. Amen, He does!

From the Finance Board.....

During May \$23,207.78 was received for the Budget. Our current budget position is shown in the table below. This information is also reported in the bulletin.

Compared to the same time period in 2021, the budget amount is 15% higher this year. Immanuel members continue to faithfully support the Daycare, Local Missions, NYG, the Daycare Playground and Sanctuary Renovations. \$1,250 was received in Memorials for Betty Govero. The "20 Lutherans Who Cook" fundraiser for the NYG earned \$879 and there was a lot of good food! Thank you for putting your name (or envelope number) on the outside of the envelope with your offering. This helps the Finance Board properly record the gifts.
