Old Testament

**Genesis 50:15–21**

<sup>15</sup>When Joseph’s brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, “It may be that Joseph will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him.” <sup>16</sup>So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, “Your father gave this command before he died, <sup>17</sup>‘Say to Joseph, Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because they did evil to you.’ And now, please forgive the transgression of the servants of the God of your father.” Joseph wept when they spoke to him. <sup>18</sup>His brothers also came and fell down before him and said, “Behold, we are your servants.” <sup>19</sup>But Joseph said to them, “Do not fear, for am I in the place of God? <sup>20</sup>As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today. <sup>21</sup>So do not fear; I will provide for you and your little ones.” Thus he comforted them and spoke kindly to them.

<sup>36</sup>[Jesus said:] “Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful. <sup>37</sup>“Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you will be forgiven; <sup>38</sup>give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you.” <sup>39</sup>He also told them a parable: “Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not both fall into a pit? <sup>40</sup>A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher. <sup>41</sup>Why do you see the speck that is in your brother’s eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? <sup>42</sup>How can you say to your brother, ‘Brother, let me take out the speck that is in your eye,’ when you yourself do not see the log

that is in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take out the speck that is in your brother's eye.”

#### **Holy Communion**

Today we celebrate Holy Communion (The Lord's Supper) which is a gift of God intended for those who have been baptized and confirmed in the Christian faith. Children and adults not communing are encouraged to come to the altar rail for a blessing. If you are uncertain about what our church teaches, you are invited to receive further instruction before participating in the sacrament. If you have any questions concerning this, please speak with Pastor. It is **imperative**, according to God's Word in 1

Corinthians 11:27-29, for a communicant to spiritually examine him/herself before coming to the Lord's Table. This should include answering "Yes" to the following questions:

1. Do you believe you are a sinner by nature and by choice?
2. Are you sorry for your sins, to leave your sins, and intend to walk a new life today?
3. Do you believe Jesus is your Lord and Savior from sin who graciously forgives your sins?
4. Do you believe and trust Christ's words that what we receive in the Sacrament is not just bread and wine, but also the very body and blood of Jesus in, with, and under these simple elements and that it provides forgiveness of sins?
5. Will you strive, with the Holy Spirit's help and guidance, to be more Christ-like in your daily life?
6. Do you recognize that participation at our table indicates public agreement with our understanding of this blessed Sacrament; confessing that all who partake of the Sacrament here are in full agreement in all teachings in God's Word?
7. Are you a member of this congregation, the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod (LCMS), or of a Christian congregation who is in "altar and pulpit" fellowship with the LCMS?

If you cannot answer yes to all of these questions, we ask that you come forward for a blessing but do not partake in the Sacrament with us until you receive further instruction in the faith and can answer yes to all these questions.
