# PENTECOST SERVICE

## AS WE GATHER

In the Nicene Creed we confess the Holy Spirit as "the Lord and giver of life," and on Pentecost, after Jesus' resurrection, the Spirit was both given to the apostles and, through them by Baptism, to 3,000 people. Today we remember that day and thank God for the gift of the Spirit, without whose gift of faith none of us "can believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him." *Luther's Small Catechism*

## INVOCATION

Pastor: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

## OPENING SENTENCES

Pastor: On Pentecost in the year our Lord Jesus rose from death, the Holy Spirit came to the apostles with great signs and gifts. That same Spirit is with each of us, for without His aid we cannot have sustaining faith in our Savior. God's presence with us, though, reminds us that He knows everything about us, including every sinful thought, word, and deed. In Psalm 139 David contemplates this truth. We read it responsively.

## PSALM 139:1-12 (13-16)

Pastor: How precious to me are Your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them!

People: O LORD, You have searched me and known me!

Pastor: You know when I sit down and when I rise up; You discern my thoughts from afar.

**People: You search out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways.**

**ALL: Even before a word is on my tongue, behold, O LORD, You know it altogether.**

### **CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION**

Pastor: Because of the faith created and sustained by the Holy Spirit we trust that God not only knows our faults, but that for Jesus' sake He promises to forgive them! Let us consider our sins, asking God for His promised forgiveness.

*(Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.)*

Pastor: Most merciful God,

**People: we confess that we have often forgotten Your gracious presence with us each day. We have grieved Your Holy Spirit with our self-centered thoughts, our unloving words, and our careless actions. We have feared worldly opposition to Your Word, keeping our faith silent in the privacy of our homes. For Jesus' sake forgive us; grant us strength of faith and opportunity to share that faith with boldness, confident of Your forgiveness, protection, and guidance.**

Pastor: Christ has ascended to heaven and sent His Holy Spirit to lead us and guide us. As a called and ordained servant of Christ and by His authority I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

**People: Amen.**

## **COLLECT OF THE DAY**

**O God, on this day You once taught the hearts of Your faithful people by sending them the light of Your Holy Spirit. Grant us in our day by the same Spirit to have a right understanding in all things and evermore to rejoice in His holy consolation; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen**

## **OLD TESTAMENT**    *Genesis 11:1-9*

<sup>1</sup>Now the whole earth had one language and the same words. <sup>2</sup>And as people migrated from the east, they found a plain in the land of Shinar and settled there. <sup>3</sup>And they said to one another, "Come, let us make bricks, and burn them thoroughly." And they had brick for stone, and bitumen for mortar. <sup>4</sup>Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth." <sup>5</sup>And the LORD came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of man had built. <sup>6</sup>And the LORD said, "Behold, they are one people, and they have all one language, and this is only the beginning of what they will do. And nothing that they propose to do will now be impossible for them. <sup>7</sup>Come, let us go down and there confuse their language, so that they may not understand one another's speech." <sup>8</sup>So the LORD dispersed them from there over the face of all the earth, and they left off building the city. <sup>9</sup>Therefore its name was called Babel, because there the LORD confused the language of all the earth. And from there the LORD dispersed them over the face of all the earth.

**EPISTLE** *Acts 2:1–21*

<sup>1</sup>When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place.

<sup>2</sup>And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup>And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. <sup>4</sup>And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

<sup>5</sup>Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. <sup>6</sup>And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. <sup>7</sup>And they were amazed and astonished, saying, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? <sup>8</sup>And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? <sup>9</sup>Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, <sup>10</sup>Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, <sup>11</sup>both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians – we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God.” <sup>12</sup>And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?” <sup>13</sup>But others mocking said, “They are filled with new wine.”

<sup>14</sup>But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, “Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. <sup>15</sup>For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. <sup>16</sup>But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel: <sup>17</sup>“And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; <sup>18</sup>even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. <sup>19</sup>And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; <sup>20</sup>the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the

great and magnificent day. <sup>21</sup>And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.”

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord.

**People: Thanks be to God.**

**GOSPEL READING** *John 14:23–31*

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 14<sup>th</sup> Chapter.

**People: Glory to You, O Lord.**

<sup>23</sup>Jesus answered him, “If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. <sup>24</sup>Whoever does not love me does not keep my words. And the word that you hear is not mine but the Father’s who sent me.

<sup>25</sup>“These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you. <sup>26</sup>But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you. <sup>27</sup>Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid. <sup>28</sup>You heard me say to you, ‘I am going away, and I will come to you.’ If you loved me, you would have rejoiced, because I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. <sup>29</sup>And now I have told you before it takes place, so that when it does take place you may believe. <sup>30</sup>I will no longer talk much with you, for the ruler of this world is coming. He has no claim on me, <sup>31</sup>but I do as the Father has commanded me, so that the world may know that I love the Father. Rise, let us go from here.

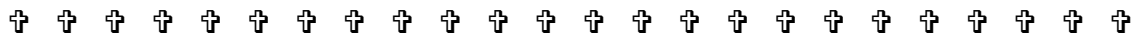
