Ask Pastor

In a recent Old Testament reading from Acts 16:9-15, Lydia, who was a worshiper of God, was baptized and her household as well because "the Lord opened her heart to pay attention to what was said by Paul." My question is: because Lydia was a worshiper of God why did her heart have to be opened? Wasn't it already opened? Also the Epistle reading was from Revelation 21:9-14, 21-27. The last verse referred to the 'Lamb's book of life'. My question on this reading is when baptism takes place, is this when Lydia and her household and anyone else who is baptized are entered in the 'Lamb's book of life'?

First, let's look at Lydia. When Paul found her, she was honoring the Sabbath, which means she was likely a Jew. This is the reference to a 'worshiper of God' as a Old Testament Jew. However, as Paul shared the Gospel she became a believer in Christ and was baptized as well as her household. So she believed in God's Old Testament promise of the messiah, and through Paul's preaching, the Holy Spirit opened her heart to believe the messiah was Jesus Christ.

Second, let's look at Revelation. When God wants to tell us about future events, He chooses one of two styles of writing: apocalyptic or prophetic. Prophetic writing reflects the role humans play in the way God's plans unfold. God chooses apocalyptic writing when He wants to show He is in complete control, and no one can stop Him from accomplishing His purposes for His people. With this being said, the 'Lamb's book of life' is not prophetic in that it does not log all names of who are baptized but the 'Lamb's book of life' is apocalyptic in that it is already complete. In other words, the Lamb's book of life is not a fluid document. If you (or Lydia) will be with Jesus in heaven, then your name always has been written in the book.

The bottom line is this: Faith in Christ is what saves and unbelief is what damns to hell. If you (like Lydia) have faith in Jesus, that he paid for your sins and you trust in Him for your forgiveness and salvation, then you (like Lydia) will be with Jesus in heaven forever.


Create this colorful July 4th craft.

What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5'x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- · Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- · Drinking straw

What you do:

- Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
- To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
- Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
- Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
- Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
- Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!

History of the Independence Day Holiday – July 4th

Variously known as the Fourth of July and Independence Day, July 4th has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, but the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution (1775-83). Independence Day, also referred to as the Fourth of July or July Fourth, has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, commemorating the adoption of the Declaration of Independence 241 years ago on July 4, 1776. The Continental Congress declared that the thirteen American colonies regarded themselves as a new nation, the United States of America, and were no longer part of the British Empire.

Independence Day is commonly associated with fireworks, parades, barbecues, carnivals, fairs, picnics, concerts, baseball games, family reunions, and political speeches and ceremonies, in addition to various other public and private events celebrating the history, government, and traditions of the United States. Independence Day is the National Day of the United States.

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the Thirteen Colonies from Great Britain in 1776 actually occurred on July 2, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia declaring the United States independent from Great Britain rule. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a Committee of Five, with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author.

Congress debated and revised the wording of the Declaration, finally approving it two days later on July 4. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail: The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more.

Adams's prediction was off by two days. From the outset, Americans celebrated independence on July 4, the date shown on the much-publicized Declaration of Independence, rather than on July 2, the date the resolution of independence was approved in a closed session of Congress.^[8]

Historians have long disputed whether members of Congress signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, even though Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and Benjamin Franklin all later wrote that they had signed it on that day. Most historians have concluded that the Declaration was signed nearly a month after its adoption, on August 2, 1776, and not on July 4 as is commonly believed. Coincidentally, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, the only signers of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as Presidents of the United States, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the Declaration. Although not a signer of the Declaration of Independence, James Monroe, another Founding Father who was elected as President, also died on July 4, 1831. He was the third President in a row who died on the anniversary of Independence. Calvin Coolidge, the 30th President, was born on July 4, 1872; so far he is the only U.S. President to have been born on Independence Day.


