From Pastor Wright

For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 8:38-39

Certainty is at a low point today. We cannot be certain that our favorite candidate will win the election. We cannot be certain that we will not contract the Coronavirus and pass it on to other people. We can't be certain we will have a job next month. We can't be certain that civil unrest won't break out in cities. We can't be certain that the stock market won't go through another sharp fall. There are so few things we can be sure of.

One thing is sure--that God loves us dearly. This is the message of the church throughout the ages. God loves all people. Jesus is the proof. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." We worship a God who is interested in us, what we are doing and thinking. He sees our needs better than we can. He answers our fears before we know them. He is truly for us.

Certainty comes when we listen to God. We have many enemies. The devil. The world. Our own flesh, or sinful nature. They fight against us and build their traps for us. The Word of God is our guide. To avoid temptation. To resist Satan. To solidify our trust that God has us. The Word of God. Holy Scripture. The Law and the Prophets. The Gospels. The Epistles. The Revelation. It's all one big love story of God for his people. It warns us of our demise in sin through the Law. It heals us with the mercy of God in the Gospel.

When we fear death, as many do right now, we can be confident. "For I am sure..." Jesus is the perfect sacrifice for us, to cleanse us, to give us his righteousness. What can our enemies do about that? "Neither death nor life, angels nor rulers, things present or things to come...nothing can separate us from the love of God through Christ Jesus our Lord."

Let's not become separated from our certainty. If you are not coming to church services right

now, be sure to watch our service on TV or internet at immanuelaltamont.org. Listen to the scriptures being read. Hear the sermon. Join in the prayers, hymns, and praises. Read the Bible and pray each day. Pray for yourself, your family, your leaders, your fellow church members. Teach your children using the resources we provide on our website.

If you are coming to church, pay close attention to what we are praying, preaching, and singing. It's all about Jesus and how he loves us. This is where our certainty comes from. No matter what, God loves us, and by faith in him we will overcome all adversities.
