

You are only as good as your last performance. So we are taught to think by a world whose motto often seems to be, "What have you done for me LATELY?"

Our society presents itself as extremely laid-back, accepting of virtually anything. In many ways, it is. Still, it tends to take a dim view when others do not do all they can to express themselves . . . in ways that society finds acceptable, that is. Society goes so far as to tell people to engage in such self-expression not to please anyone else, but strictly for themselves.

This can become a crushing burden. You must fashion an identity for yourself. Make sure it is genuine, not something you are merely copying from someone. Then at all times live it, and live up to it. In the end, this kind of project takes people nowhere. Really, no one can rest with saying, "I don't care what anyone else thinks." For you really do care.

What we all need is an approving word from outside ourselves, from someone who loves us. We need an approving word from One Whose judgment upon us matters supremely, regardless of any failings of ours or any feelings of others.

In a Bible passage to be read at our church this Sunday, St. Paul wrote that "whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." Paul wanted to be "found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith" (Philippians 3:7-9).

A book title said it all: not "self-esteem" but "Christ-esteem"!
