

**TO OUR GUESTS:** Welcome to Immanuel. We pray that you will be blessed worshipping the Lord with His people. Please sign a guest attendance card and place it at the end of your row. Please join us often.

THE LORD'S SUPPER is celebrated today. Here Jesus gives us His true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. Scripture teaches that anyone who eats and drinks the body and blood of Christ without discerning the body and blood received a judgment rather than a blessing from God (1 Cor. 11:29). Therefore, out of Christian concern for souls, we require thorough instruction in the teaching of the Lutheran Church before coming to the sacrament. Communion is also a testimony of unity of faith with all others who partake (1 Cor. 10:27). Since unity at the altar means unity in doctrine and confession, we ask that only those who are in confessional fellowship with The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod attend the Lord's Supper. If you would like to come forward to receive a blessing, fold your hands across your chest before the pastor during the communion.

Prayer Campaign for Life: Our Church will soon be participating in the annual "Prayer Campaign for Life," 40 days focused on building a pro-life culture. We will be joining people of faith across our nation to pray, fast, and serve to end abortion and to fight physician-assisted suicide. Immanuel's prayer days are <a href="Friday">Friday</a>, September 29<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 30<sup>th</sup>. Sign up to pray for 30 minutes. Sign-up sheets will be at all three entrances to church. Pastor will provide a prayer list. God heard the pro-life prayers of our nation, and blessed us by overturning Roe v. Wade in 2022. What a huge victory! We have the wonderful opportunity to pray in thanksgiving for this gift. Unfortunately, the average number of abortions committed in our state increased by over 1,300 per month after Roe was overturned. People in surrounding states view our state as an abortion "haven", since Illinois has no abortion restrictions. We have much to pray for!

<u>Dear Congregation Members</u>, The Board of Elders has been approached in regard to offering communion every Sunday and we would like your input on this subject. We feel that it is important that all communicant members give prayerful consideration about the practice and voice their opinions in a survey that we will conduct beginning on September 9<sup>th</sup> and end on October 15<sup>th</sup>.
