



A Total Solar Eclipse will happen tomorrow, Monday, April 8, around 2 PM (CST) and Altamont is in the path. From New Mexico to Maine a shadow of the moon will be cast across the USA. The closer to the center of the shadow's path, the better the view. I'll be heading toward Mt. Vernon with my



family to watch. I hope you can get outdoors to see it, but be sure to use the special filtering glasses or you may damage your eyes.

Eclipses are naturally occurring phenomenon. There have been several voices saying this is a special judgment of God against us. This is true, but only in part. Whenever we see the power of nature, we should think of the God who made all things. Whether it is a great mountain, an ocean, the stars at night, or a total eclipse of the sun, we should give glory to the creator God who fashioned the world. Not only did He make all things that we behold with our eyes and ears, but He still uses his power to sustain them. When we see the power of God, we should also consider how far we fall short of His expectation for us. We have not lived the life that he instructed us to live. This is a reminder of God's judgment on us.

So in that sense, the eclipse is a judgement of God upon us. I am also reminded of the times where the sun stood still or was hidden, which were not naturally occurring phenomenon, but were caused by God's interaction in human history. God caused the sun to stay still in the sky at the battle of Gibeon. In those days the five kings of the Amorites attacked the people of Gibeon. Joshua prayed to God that the sun would stay in the sky for an extra day in order to rout all the enemy from the land, and the Lord granted it, as recorded in Joshua chapter ten:

The sun stopped in the middle of the sky and delayed going down about a full day. ¹⁴There has never been a day like it before or since, a day when the LORD listened to a human being. Surely the LORD was fighting for Israel!

Another time was at the death of Jesus. The gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke record that darkness covered the earth from the sixth hour (noon) to the ninth hour (3 pm) when Jesus died. This is a judgement not on the people of earth, but on Jesus himself, as he took responsibility for all the sins of every person who ever lived. This was not an eclipse, because it lasted for three hours, not ten minutes. Also, because Jesus was crucified at the time of the Passover festival,

which is celebrated at a full moon, it is impossible for an eclipse to happen. The sun must shine on the face of the moon to be reflected for us to see it on earth during a full moon. For that to happen the moon must be located to the side of the earth, not between the earth and the sun.

What caused the sun to be dark for three hours? There is no way to know, and it is not necessary to know. It is a miracle. Whether it was something in the atmosphere, or a failure of the sun to shine at all, all we can say is it was caused directly by God to show God's judgment on sin. Jesus took that into himself and carried it into death, thereby freeing us from its guilt and shame.

The sun will stop shining once and for all when Jesus returns to earth. Matthew 24 records Jesus saying, "In those days the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then will appear in heaven the sign of the Son of Man" (Matthew 24:29-30).

As you see the eclipse tomorrow, thank God for his power in creating such wonders, and for his grace in making the sun a sign of the lifting of his judgment of your sin, and a sign of Jesus triumphal return to earth. He will bring us to a new heaven and a new earth. It will be the home of God's righteousness for us.
