First Sunday in Advent—Mark 13:24-37

Jesus speaks these words to Peter, James and John; and He compares the life of the Church until His return to—are you ready for this?—
They should be doing what Jesus has given them to do.
So, what authority has given to His people?
However, keep in mind that the Lord entrusts different individuals with different to do.
So what has Jesus given you to do?
Jesus gives you authority to be Hissomething you could not do on your own.
Only because of His and resurrection, you have the authority to say, "I am God's beloved"
Once again, this declares to you that you have the authority by Jesus to be, to no longer be guilty for sin.
First and foremost, He gives you the authority to be!
Be forgiven: your housework is really no work at all, because has done all the work by His life, death and resurrection.
Now that Jesus has spoken forgiveness to us, He now gives us the authority to others.
Likewise, you hear God's and believe that your Savior will come again in glory. Believing and, you're prepared.
Faith loves repentance, because of sin also includes the forgiveness of the Gospel.
And in a way, waiting for the's return is much different from the next 28 days—the Lord has done all the work for your salvation, and your "" is not first to do, but to be: be forgiven.
