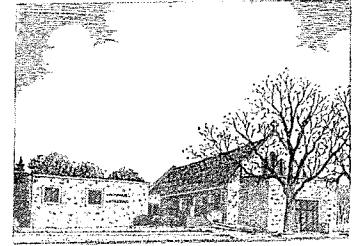

### Newsletter Article

This past month we celebrated the 500 anniversary of Martin Luther making his stand on the Word of God. He was called upon to recant his writings and teachings of God's Word. But he stood strong on God's Word. Here is some information about that time, this comes from the LCMS Here I Stand Sunday material:

It could have all ended the evening of April 18, 1521. The sun was beginning to set on the city of Worms. The heat was stifling in the packed room of the bishop's palace where emperor, electors and German princes all waited with anticipation to hear the answer Martin Luther would bring. Would Luther recant? Would he retract what he had written and said against abuses in the church and against papal tyranny? Most of all, would he give up on the Gospel he had preached and taught, giving comfort and certainty to consciences in Christ?

"Martin, answer clearly and without any double-talk: Do you or do you not recant your books and the errors in them?" If Luther were to recant and admit that he was wrong, all would be well before the emperor and the Roman Catholic Church. On the other hand, if he did not recant, his own life

would be at risk. He could be burned as a heretic.

This was it: recant or stand firm.

With beads of sweat on his face, Luther responded:

"Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures or by clear reason (for I do not trust either in the pope or in councils alone, since it is well known that they have often erred and contradicted themselves), I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not retract anything, since it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience. I cannot do otherwise, here I stand, may God help me, Amen" (LW 32:112-13).

At this bold confession, the room erupted in noise. Some rejoiced; some demanded fire! Yet, in the midst of such commotion, the truth of Jesus Christ rang forth. The gates of Hades had not prevailed over the confession of the Gospel. The proclamation of justification by grace through faith on account of Christ's work *alone* did not bend to spiritual tyranny.

Today, we stand in the footsteps of Martin Luther 500 years later. We stand boldly, proclaiming the One who has called us out of darkness into His marvelous light. We stand boldly, renouncing the devil and all his works and all his ways. We stand, by the grace of God, steadfast and ready to suffer all rather than fall away. We do not stand on Luther, but we will gladly stand with him, firm on the testimony of the Holy Scriptures to confess the saving Gospel of Christ, our Good Shepherd, who died and rose, in whose name is forgiveness of sins for all people. Here we stand; we can do no other. God help us. Amen.

This brings to mind that this is something that we need and have to do today. We need to stand strong on God's Word and the message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Especially in this day when so many want to get rid of God's Word, to get rid of Jesus and what He has done for us, the forgiveness of sins that He earned for us on the cross and His resurrection from the dead.

We as God's Church, as God's people, are being encouraged and even shamed into changing what God has said to us in His Word. We are encouraged and told to change God's Word so that every one feels good about who they are in themselves, that God does not care about our sins, so it is okay if we sin, that you can be good enough to earn heaven, that you do not need Jesus Christ. But we are not to change God's Word, we are not to add to it or take away from it (See Deuteronomy 4:2 and Revelation 22:18-19). If we change God's Word our salvation will be lost, we will be

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Greetings in the Name of our Risen Savior, Jesus Christ!

As we enter into the month of May, I'm reflecting on the wonderful gift God gives us in the season of our life as His people. The basic rhythm began in the garden. God set the sun, moon and stars in the sky to order our days and months and seasons and years. And then He gave to us the Sabbath Day, when He rested from His work of creation: So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all his work that he had done in creation. (Genesis 2:3 ESV)

In all of this we are reminded that God has appointed these seasons and times and rhythms in order to bless us. As Solomon writes, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." (Ecclesiastes 3:1 ESV). As we experience the season and times and rhythms

lost. With Luther we make a stand on God's Word concerning our salvation, our forgiveness of sins, concerning the creation of man, male and female; that marriage is between one man and one woman; taking the life of the unborn or taking the life of those we think do not make any contribution to society; that sex outside of marriage is wrong and sinful in God's eyes, that we can not save ourselves, that Jesus is the only way to heaven, that we need a Savior and that Savior is Jesus Christ, God's only Son who came and took our sins upon Himself and died on the cross and rose from the dead that we have forgiveness and life with Him.

We make a stand on God's Word sharing the message of Jesus Christ, Him crucified and risen for the forgiveness of sins. We make a stand on God's Word sharing the hope and peace and joy we have knowing that we are forgiven and have a place prepared for us in heaven. We make a stand on God's Word when come to the Divine Service and receive the gifts that God gives to us through His Word and Sacraments. We take a stand on God's Word when we have family devotions and spend time in God's Word at home. We take a stand on God's Word when we raise our children in the Word of God, when we send our children to Sunday School and school. We make a stand on God's Word when we do not back down and hide our faith from others. We make a stand on God's Word when we share Jesus and show Jesus to those around us.

I pray that the Holy Spirit will work in our hearts and help us make a stand on God's Word, proclaiming the true Word of God.

May God bless and keep each one of you in His grace and care.

St. Paul teaches us: "Let the one who is taught the word share all good things with the one who teaches" (Gal. 6:6). And again, he says: "Do you not know that those who are employed in the temple service get their food from the temple, and those who serve at the altar share in the sacrificial offerings? In the same way, the Lord commanded that those who proclaim the gospel should get their living by the gospel" (1 Cor. 9:13–14). In other words, ministers of the Gospel are supported by the offerings of those who are served by them.

And this is how the church lives even now. It is standard practice. But this deserves closer examination. For it instructs us not just *that* we are to give but also *what* we are to give. And it does so with four little words: "In the same way ..."

St. Paul is building his case for supporting the preachers of the Gospel with the sacrificial giving of individual members on the example of the Old Testament people who supported the Levites with their offerings and sacrifices. We're to support the Gospel ministry "in the same way." But how did the Old Testament people support the Levites?

Moses records this: "You shall tithe all the yield of your seed that comes from the field year by year. And before the Lord your God, in the place that he will choose, to make his name dwell there, you shall eat the tithe of your grain, of your wine, and of your oil, and the firstborn of your herd and flock, that you may learn to fear the Lord your God always" (Deut. 14:22–23). The Levites were supported by the tithe, 10 percent of all the yearly yield of that which was harvested.

Does that seem like a lot? Does it surprise you that St.

may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel (Ephesians 6:18-19 ESV)

I ask you, also, to keep alert and keep praying with me. God has given us students, not only to teach them knowledge and skills for life in this world, but also and most profoundly, that they would know Christ and the promise of forgiveness and life that comes through His cross and resurrection. And for this high calling our teachers and our staff need your prayers. And I need them too.

Paul instructs us that we are to support the New Testament Gospel ministry "in the same way?" If it does, ask yourself: Is the church's job in the New Testament bigger or smaller than the Levites' job in the Old Testament? Back then, there was one Temple, and the ministry was almost exclusively located in one nation among the descendants of Abraham. In Matthew 28, Jesus calls us to teach and baptize all nations, and there are churches and ministries all around the world! How could we support this new Gospel ministry with anything less than the Israelites supported the Old Testament ministry?

Of course, we are free to give more, for we have received more than those in the Old Testament. We have received the fullness of God's revelation, the fullness of His salvation, and the fulfillment of everything that God promised to do. For we have received Christ, God's own Son, in the flesh, who took upon himself our sins and in exchange gave us his righteousness. The Father claimed us as his own in Holy Baptism. He gathers us together in the place where his name dwells to feast on the first fruits of the resurrection, the risen and living body and blood of His Son – our Lord Jesus. He reminds us that we are His, that all things are ours because we belong to Him. He blesses us here in time with physical and spiritual gifts.

In the same way – and in response to His fatherly divine goodness and mercy – we gladly give to those who proclaim to us "the excellencies of him who called us out of darkness and into his marvelous light." For once we were not a people, but now we are God's people; once we had not received mercy, but now we have indeed (1 Peter 2:9–10).

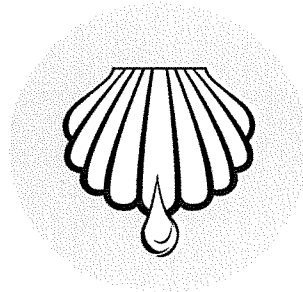
