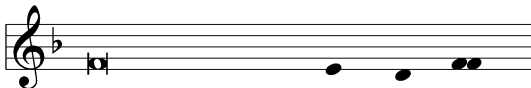
The prophets had promised it of old. Mary sees it fulfilled in her Son, so she sings:

The Savior came in meekness

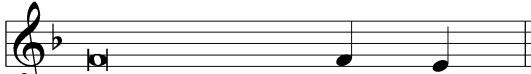
