Epistle

Romans 12:9–21

A The Epistle is from Romans, chapter 12.

Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality.

Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be conceited. Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, “Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.” To the contrary, “if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head.” Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, “Far be it from you, Lord! This shall never happen to you.” But he turned and said to Peter, “Get behind me, Satan! You are a hindrance to me. For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man.”

Then Jesus told his disciples, “If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. Matins Vocabulary

Matins: Morning Service of psalms, readings, and prayers. The first of eight daily prayer services that developed during the Middle Ages for use in the monasteries. At the time of the Reformation, these services were reduced to two: Matins in the morning and Vespers in the evening. Matins is a Middle English word that comes from Latin for "of the morning."

Antiphon: A verse of Scripture repeated at the beginning and end of a psalm or Introit.

Collect: A brief, structured prayer, usually consisting of five parts; address to God, basis for the prayer, petition, desired benefit or result, and trinitarian conclusion.

Kyrie: From the Greek "Kyrie eleison," which means "Lord, have mercy"

Responsory: Scripture verses sung or spoken after the reading of Scripture in Matins, Vespers, and Compline.

Venite: Latin for "O Come," Initial words of Psalm 95, sung as the first psalm in Matins.

Sabaoth: Hebrew for "heavenly hosts," including "angels, archangels, and all the company of heaven."

Te Deum: Latin for "[we praise] You, O God." Ancient canticle of praise sung in Matins.
