A Meditation

P: Congratulations! You're expecting a baby—today! Many of you may be surprised by this news. But didn't you come here today expecting to hear the birth announcement of the baby Jesus? Well, maybe you didn't expect him to actually be here in person. After all, Jesus was born some 2000 years ago, far away from here.

You just came to remember the event with a joyful celebration. Right? Perhaps you even came expecting a chance to truly reflect upon and give thanks for the incredible sacrifice Jesus made for you when he died on a cross so long ago, and you look forward to someday living with him in heaven.

But did you actually come expecting a baby to be born to you today? That changes everything. But it is indeed what you can and should expect. The birth of Jesus is the fulfillment of God's promise to send a Savior—his own Son—to bless people of every time and every nation.

And though his days on earth in human flesh were only a few years, he is with us still today. He is born to us today and every day, bringing renewal to our weariness; bringing light to our darkness; bringing his power to our weakness; bringing guidance for our questions and quandaries, and bringing salvation from every sin that holds us captive.

Jesus is Immanuel—God With Us. Therefore, as the angel Gabriel told Mary, (pointing to congregation) you are highly favored. The Lord is with you. Expect him. Cherish hm. Pray, "Jesus, be born—in us— today."

Be Born in Us Today...Bringing Blessing

Luke 1:26-35

The angel Gabriel was sent from God ... to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, from the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you! But she was greatly troubled at the saying ... and the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God.

And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High ... and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you ... therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God."

P: When Mary's fiancé, Joseph, heard the news about Jesus, he was afraid and wanted out.

Matthew 1:20-21

"Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

P: They didn't feel prepared at all, but Mary and Joseph trusted that their baby was God's gift of a Savior promised long ago. But God's plan was right on schedule. Not like this shower gift that came late! God had said the Savior would be born in Bethlehem.

Micah 5:2

But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah ... from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days.

Luke 2:1-5

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to be registered, each to his own town. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, who was with child.

P: Mary and Joseph probably didn't understand everything that was happening, but one thing is for sure. When Jesus was born, he brought blessings to them, and to the whole world!

Be Born in Us Today ...Bringing Renewal

P: This gift can also remind us of how the baby born in Bethlehem is still with us today bringing renewal.

Luke 2:6-7

3

While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

P: The baby Jesus would bring renewal. More than physical comfort, Jesus came to renew his people who are weary from sin and the pressures of a sinful world.

Isaiah 40:30-31

Even youths shall faint and be weary, and young men shall fall exhausted; but they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not be faint. (Isaiah 40:30-31)

P: He renews us in this life and promises eternal life with him with no more crying from anyone.

Revelation 21:4

He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more. Neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away.

Be Born in Us Today...Bringing Light

P: I believe I can shine some light on this subject. This night light can remind us that Jesus brings light to a world of uncertainty. That's right. Because of sin, we often let fear, selfishness and pride control us. That leads us to some dark places. So we need the light of Jesus to shine in our hearts and show us the goodness of God's plans for us. Remember the "night light" God sent the shepherds the night Jesus was born?

Luke 2:8-12

There were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger."

P: But he gives us something even brighter. He shines in our hearts each day and gives us faith to see Jesus.

2 Corinthians 4:6

For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

P: This night light will help us see our baby in a dark nursery, but Jesus' light will let us see his love in all our dark places.

Be Born in Us Today...Bringing Power

P: That's right. The angels that appeared to the shepherds made that perfectly clear.

Luke 2:13-14

Suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of heavenly host praising God and saying: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased."

P: The power of God was wrapped in swaddling clothes that night. Jesus, the Son of God, was born to us. The Bible calls him King of kings and Lord of lords. That's why the shepherds wanted everyone to know about him.

Luke 2:15-20

When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

P: Jesus has power over sin, the devil and even death. Jesus' power is stronger than anything else! And his power is at work in us, just like it was in the shepherds who went and told everyone the good news of Jesus. Jesus, you have the highest chair in this house. Let's praise him together with a song.

Be Born in Us Today...Bringing Guidance

P: And with his children's Bible, we can teach him about Jesus. That's very important because the Bible doesn't just tell stories about Jesus. It's where we actually meet Jesus. Jesus has been with us since before the beginning of time. Some were able to see him when he came to earth, but even now, he is with us as our Lord and Savior, teaching and guiding us through his Word.

John 1:1-3, 14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

P: The Bible tells us that God's Word is a lamp to our feet and a light to our path. We can't see Jesus the same way the shepherds did, but we see him right here in his Word which guides us to him.

P: A baby does change everything. And baby Jesus brought us the biggest change of all. Jesus was born to bring salvation. That's a fancy way of saying he saved us. Now our lives will never be the same.

Luke 1:67-70

Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has visited and redeemed his people and raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David, as he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets from of old.

P: I learned in Sunday school that our sins deserve God's punishment. Yeah, but Jesus took that punishment for us by dying on a cross. Now God forgives all our sins. Not only that but Jesus rose from the dead. His victory over death won for us life forever in heaven with him. This cross is a gift to celebrate the day your baby brother will be baptized and become a child of God. It reminds us of our own baptisms when we became a part of God's family. A family changed forever! OK, baby brother, we're ready for you. You can be born anytime. And Jesus, we want you to be born in us—all of us—today.
