A Dubious Distinction

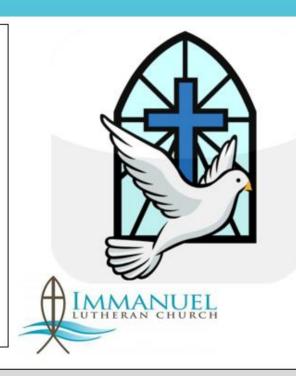
Your summer activities should allow you to stay active while also enjoying the activities you love. Stay lively, healthy and happy as you enjoy summer!

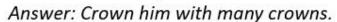
