P: Since we are gathered here to hear the Word of God, receive the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ in the

fellowship of this altar, and render unto Him our thanks and praise, let us first consider our unworthiness and confess before God and one another that we have sinned and cannot save ourselves. The Bible says, "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us." [1 John 1:8]

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON DEUTERONOMY 8:1-10

Be careful to follow every command I am giving you today, so that you may live and increase and may enter and possess the land that the LORD promised on oath to your forefathers. Remember how the LORD your God led you all the way in the desert these forty years, to humble you and to test you in order to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep

his commands. He humbled you, causing you to hunger and then feeding you with manna, which neither you nor your fathers had known, to teach you that man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD. Your clothes did not wear out and your feet did not swell during these forty years. Know then in your heart that as a man disciplines his son, so the LORD your God disciplines you.

Observe the commands of the LORD your God, walking in his ways and revering him. For the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land—a land with streams and pools of water, with springs flowing in the valleys and hills; a land with wheat and barley, vines and fig trees, pomegranates, olive oil and honey; a land where bread will not be scarce and you will lack nothing; a land where the rocks are iron and you can dig copper out of the hills.

When you have eaten and are satisfied, praise the LORD your God for the good land he has given you.

NEW TESTAMENT LESSON

1 CORINTHIANS 1:4-9

I always thank God for you because of his grace given you in Christ Jesus. For in him you have been enriched in every way—in all your speaking and in all your knowledge—because our testimony about Christ was confirmed in you. Therefore you do not lack any spiritual gift as you eagerly wait for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed. He will keep you strong to the end, so that you will be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. [9] God, who has called you into fellowship with his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, is faithful.

HOLY GOSPEL

LUKE 18:9-14

To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everybody else, Jesus told this parable: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood up and prayed about himself: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men—robbers,

evildoers, adulterers—or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get.'

"But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.'

"I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

THE CONFESSION OF FAITH The First Article of the Apostle's Creed with the explanation from Luther's Small Catechism

- P: I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth. What does this mean?
- C: I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes and ears and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still preserves them.
- P: Also clothing and shoes, meat and drink, house and home, wife and children, fields, cattle, and all my goods;
- C: That He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life; that He defends me against all danger, and guards and protects me from all evil;
- P: And all this purely out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me
- C: For all which it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is most certainly true.

THE CONSECRATION

P: Our Lord Jesus has given His people a wonderful and mysterious way to receive the gift of His grace and forgiveness that He earned for us through His life, death, and resurrection. It is found in this simple meal of bread and wine. When we set these foods aside for this special use, according to His instruction, and faithfully connect the words and promises of Jesus to them, they are no longer simple bread and wine. They are the very Body and Blood of Jesus. This is the feast of victory. Here we are fed and nourished with the abundance of God's grace.

This is a great mystery, but one that we accept as true because of what Jesus said on the night He met with His disciples for a last Passover feast. On that night, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying:

- C: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for You. Do this for the remembrance of me."
- P: Again, after supper, He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave

- it for all to drink, saying:
- C: "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, shed for You and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of Me."
- P: Remembering, therefore, His salutary command, His lifegiving Passion and death, His glorious resurrection and ascension, and His promise to come again, we pray...
- C: We give thanks to You, Lord God Almighty, not as we ought, but as we are able. We implore You to accept our praise and thanksgiving, and, with Your Word and Holy Spirit, to bless us.
- P: Bless these Your own gifts of bread and wine; that we and all who share in the body and blood of Your Son may be filled with heavenly peace and joy, and, receiving the forgiveness of sin, may be sanctified in soul and body, and have our portion with all Your saints.
- C: All glory and honor is Yours, O God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit now and forever. Amen.
