C: **God forgive us for our failure to love one another.**

P: We confess our faithless ways.

C: **God forgive us for our failure to believe and trust Your promises.**

P: Jesus came into the world to save us from our sins, failures and misguided ways.

C: **Gracious and merciful God forgive us our sins; and by the power of Your Holy Spirit, help us to believe Your Word, trust Your promises and live faithfully as Your beloved children.**

P: God almighty has had mercy on you and sent Jesus into this world to be born of human flesh, suffer and die for your sins, rise from the grave and live and reign for all eternity as your Savior. As a called and ordained servant of the Word, and by the command of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, I forgive you all of your sins in the name of the Father and of the † Son and of the Holy Spirit.

P: On the night when he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it and gave it to the disciples saying: “Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.”

P: Almighty God, send now, we pray, Your Holy Spirit, the spirit of our Lord and of His Church, that we who receive the Lord's body and blood may live to the praise of Your glory and receive our inheritance with all Your saints in light.

C: Amen. Come, Holy Spirit.

At King of Kings, we welcome at Holy Communion all baptized Christians who believe that Jesus Christ is present in this Sacrament and that forgiveness of sins is given in it. Children who have not yet been instructed to receive Holy Communion and those who are not yet baptized are invited to come forward to receive a blessing. SCRIPTURE VERSES

- P: The prophet Isaiah wrote, "The people living in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned." [Mt 4:16]
- P: The devout man, Simeon, moved by the Spirit took Jesus into his arms and said, "Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you now dismiss your servant in peace. My eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all people, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." [Lk 2:31-32]
- P: St. John the Evangelist begins his Gospel saying, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it." [Jn 1:1-5]
