#### A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOODBANK

Food Bank is still going strong with feeding approximately 1500 to 2400 per week. In addition to our other commitments, we've now taken on a special-needs daycare of 40 kids, a small homeless camp, as well as the victims of the Fairwood flres. I picked up our first load from Food Lifeline & was able to store it easily due to the new refrigeration unit, which we are extremely grateful for! It has definitely been used. We,re still running low on dry cereal; things like Cheerios are always great & kid friendly cereals have been extremely helpful over the summer months. Another item we could use is Kraft Mac & Cheese. I don't know why but kids like the Kraft best. As school gets back, I,m sure we will start serving our three elementary schools again. We did continue to serve one over the summer where the teacher delivered to the families homes & we were also able to get some of the families on the United Way list for the summer. Thank you for your continued support of Food Bank. With food prices continuing to rise, food insecurity is still a very real thing.

Celebrate the new school year w/ food & fun! Outside if good weather.

In the Youth Room -See you there!!



The beginning of the school year can be stressful for kids & parents. Here is an activity you can do together as a family that can help manage that stress as well as other strong emotions. Gather enough supplies for each person to make their own jar. Here's what you will need:

#### **Ingredients**

- •A clear jar with a tight-fitting lid
- Water
- Clear glue or glitter glue
- Dry glitter

#### **Instructions**

- 1. Cover the whole surface of your workspace for easy cleanup.
- 2. Fill the jar with glue until it is about 1/4 to 1/3 full.
- 3. Add hot water until the jar is about ¾ of the way full, leaving 1-2" from the lid. This allows space to add more glue & helps minimize splashing when stirring in the glitter.
- 4. The best step! Add glitter. It is impossible to have too much glitter. Stir along the way to check how the glitter moves, making sure it's the speed & swirl you want.
- 5. Screw the lid back on tight. Give the jar a good shake.
- 6. Add more glitter, glue, & hot water, as you see fit until the jar is full.
- 7. Screw the lid back on & make sure everything is just as you want it.

If desired, when you're done, hot glue the lid on to avoid leaking.

Finally, use the following script or take inspiration from it to form your own explanation:

"Imagine that the glitter is like your thoughts. When you're stressed, mad or upset, shake the jar. Notice how it swirls around & makes it hard to see clearly? That's why it's so easy to make silly decisions or calm yourself when you're upset – because you're not thinking clearly."

Take some time to be still & watch the glitter as it gently falls & settles. Ask children to notice how they feel now that the glitter has settled. Remind them that just as the glitter settles, their big emotions will settle also.




