A Message from our Congregation President - Jackie Kinunen

One of my favorite daily devotions is "First 15". It came with a little card holder that holds the "card for the day" and each card has a different quote. My card for today says "The choice of how you will spend this year is entirely up to you. The time you spend with God is of eternal value". Did you make a New Year's resolution this year? And how is that going? I decided not to do that, but I did decide that this year I wanted to spend more time in bible study and in prayer. I joined Bible Study Fellowship and we are studying about the kings and prophets of the Old Testament. I visit a 91-year old Christian woman who has gone completely blind in the last couple years. She frequently says, "if I had known this was going to happen, I would have memorized more scripture!" I'm trying to do that but boy, memorization is difficult at this age!

We are blessed to be part of a congregation where prayer and bible study are high priorities. We live in a world that is increasingly indifferent and even hostile to God's Word. We are called to be a light in community, sharing the Gospel in words and actions. So many churches are closing their doors because their congregations just got too small. Our neighbor church, Bethlehem Lutheran is going to be closing their doors this spring, and I am hoping that many of their members might join us a King of Kings. More about that later!

Would you make praying for the future of King of Kings a special priority this year? I hope to spend time this year with the MLG and Elders proactively planning for the long-term future of our church. I know God has a long-term plan for King of Kings, and we need to be ready! "O God, our help in ages past, our hope for years to come."

KING OF KINGS PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN

2023-2024 REGISTRATION

We opened our registration for current preschool and church members on January 17th. Our registration for all other community members begins February 6th. If you know someone who would be a good fit for our program, we would love to speak with them, show them around the school, and have them sign up!



Our preschool is offered to all children 3-5 years of age. Our KING OF KINGS PRESCHOOL Kindergarten program is a half-day program for children who are PLAY, LEARN AND GROW TOGETHER! five by August 31. We have a two-day-a-week session for our three-year-olds, a three-day-a-week session for our four-year-olds, and a five-day-a-week session for our older four-year-olds. We also offer a Junior Kindergarten class for children who turn five between September 1, 2023, and December 31, 2023, and who show readiness for kindergarten.

This class meets every morning, Monday through Friday.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOODBANK

Every month you see the food bank article and what item we're requesting. Maybe it's cereal or chili. You think about purchasing some thing but then you remember how Food Bank has exploded. Maybe you have seen the road blocked on a Saturday for people coming to our drive through. Maybe you think your box of cereal doesn't make a difference. Well you're wrong. It makes a huge difference. In the last month and a half we made 93 non perishable boxes for families in need in schools in our area. That means 93 boxes of cereal, 93 jars of peanut butter, and 93 or more cans of chili or tuna. We provide them pasta and sauce, dry potatoes, milk, canned fruit/veggies and soup. Enough meals for a family of 4 for a week plus. Another new place your donations may go is to the newish permanent residential housing in Kent. They have small apartment like rooms and are responsible for their own food and linens etc. We've helped them set up a small pantry/grocery type store so that residents can 'shop' for things to sustain them for the week. Over 50 veterans live there. Now you have a better idea of what we do with your donations throughout the month.

This month's requested items are canned fruit and rice. . Either brown or white.

Thank you as always for your support. It is vital for our many missions. That box or two of cereal you brought may have provided a meal for a child There's absolutely no way we could ever help as many as we do without? your generosity. Your support and prayers mean a ton.

MAT Leaders and Treasurer submit budget proposals for 2023-2024



After prayerful thought, let our Mission Leadership Group (MLG) and MAT leaders know what you think should be our priorities to fulfill our mission.

MAT Leaders will review each line item in their budget to determine how well their expenses are meeting their MAT goals over the last 6 months. And they will assess how well they are spending vs their budget. They will make proposed budget adjustments as necessary for the next fiscal year.


