Love God. Love your neighbor.

That is one way to summarize the Christian life; but loving God is different from loving your neighbor. Loving God is primary and requires obedience. [See Deuteronomy 11:1 and John 14:15] Loving your neighbor is secondary. In fact, we cannot love our neighbor if we don't love God first; because it is God's love for us that enables us to love our neighbor. [See 1 John 4:19]

Love and obedience to God go together; but sometimes our obedience to God is misinterpreted by the world as being loveless toward our neighbor. Love for God does not require us to obey our neighbor—serve our neighbor, yes; submit to his worldly values, no. Be kind to our neighbor, yes; deny the realities of sin, no.

This is the truth: God is love and He has chosen to love us unconditionally and completely. God so loved the world that He sent Jesus to suffer and die in our place to save us from our

sins on Good Friday and rise on Easter Sunday. That is the message of love that we have received from God and seek to share with our words and deeds with our neighbor.

I am spreading the gospel of the Lord to Sudanese in North America and the United States of America. In Washington state in the cities Seattle, Renton, Kent, Auburn, and Kennewick. I am doing home visits, visiting hospitals, jails, courts, and as an interpreter for migrants. Including that I was in Sioux City, Iowa spreading the Gospel in the Midwest Feb 5th. They gave me the title of Missionary at Large. The picture is of them and I will continue teaching them through March.

We are teaching Nuer children here by Evangelist Drear yier Lual. King of Kings is greeting people about Jesus Christ Our Lord welcoming them into Christ Jesus amen and amen. I and Pat Gorman were comforting two families who lost their daughters, God with us. I as a preacher share the gospels to them always. #### 2023-2024 REGISTRATION

Registration for 2023-2024 school year is open! If you know someone who would be a good fit for our program, we would love to speak with them, show them around the school, and have them sign up!

Our preschool is offered to all children 3-5 years of age. Our Kindergarten program is a half-day program for children who are five by August 31. We have a two-day-a-week session for our three-year-olds, a three-day-a-week session for our four-yearolds, and a five-day-a-week session for our older four-year-olds. We also offer a Junior Kindergarten class for children who turn five between September 1, 2023, and December 31, 2023, and who show readiness for kindergarten. #### A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOODBANK

A big shout out to everyone who contributed to the winter sock, coat and blanket drive! We were able to provide 161 pairs of new socks (largely due to Faith circle), 53 blankets, 33 men's coats, and 16 warm coats for women. We also received a countless number of miscellaneous articles of clothing. The items were picked up by our contact for the veterans last week. The majority were contributed to them. We were also able to provide blankets and socks to two local shelters, Kents permanent residential housing facility, and even an elementary school with a request for two blankets and some children's sweats. Job wonderfully done everyone!

As you will know, the cost of everything has gone up. Food, gas and clothing. We have seen an increase in need at Food Bank recently, as well as an increased request for clothing. So, good news! You're not too late! There's still time to clean out those closets or grab some socks or PJs or off the clearance rack. 




