



A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOODBANK

Some of you have asked about the bags we are making for the needy families at elementary schools. This is where your donations are vital and greatly appreciated. In February we did 63 of these. In March so far we've delivered 84. Here is a photo of what typically goes in each bag. Of course, It varies depending on stock available. They're intended to feed a family of four. Right now we are in need of canned chili, hot or cold cereal and instant mashed potatoes. We are also in need of feminine hygiene.

In case you've never been around church on a Saturday, here's a photo of what happens in our drive-through. We hand out boxes of produce, eggs and milk. People can then park to get other items like bread as well as other produce and miscellaneous items. On Saturday we feed approximately 2000 people.






Facilitator: Rebekka Sollars, M.S.


