

Dear Friends in Christ,

Statistics are a useful tool. Sometimes they support the truth and sometimes they do not. Statistics alone do not determine what is true and what is not. For instance, the most reliable statistic is the one-to-one correlation between life and death. Everyone who lives, dies. Even Lazarus, only he got to die twice. Think about that for a moment. Jesus skews the statistics.

St. Paul speaks of another important statistic when he writes, "Just as through the disobedience of the one man [Adam] the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man [Jesus] the many will be made righteous." [Rom 5:19] St. John explains it this way, "He [Jesus] is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world."

How many sins have you committed? Jesus died for each and every one of them. They have been atoned for. You are forgiven.

Jesus distorts the data even further by His resurrection. He lived. He died. He rose. He ascended and He promises, "He who lives and believes in me will never die." [Jn 11:26]

Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life, [Jn 14:6] no matter what the statistics might say.

Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ, I wanted to share the difficult lives the Sudanese have in the United States or the State of Washington. We have lost in the last two days the second son of Pastor Simon and Gatbell's daughter passed away as well as his cousin Chang Kuolt Rut in this same month. It is choking us as a Sudanese people and also the war that is happening in North Sudan. We have many Nuer people who live there. Pray for us please. Many people here in Seattle have called me and I was praying a lot with my people, meaning Sudanese, but they are people of God.

For my future plans I will be going to Anchorage Lutheran Church for commissioning 4 deaconesses' on May 7-23rd. I might miss our church meeting.

I have been continuing to share the words of God, preaching at homes and churches, encouraging the Sudanese those who have lost their families, Worshiping God with the Sudanese around here, Preached about Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Resurrection and Jesus causing our hearts to burn from the Gospel of Luke: 24:13-35. ### A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOODBANK

Food Bank continues to be extra busy. We are working hard on getting people off the street. Pastor has been more successful in the last few weeks and Food Bank line has gone much quicker. The first week in April we fed 4014 people That includes Saturday as well as schools, homeless and shelters. We've had another school and a community college request help.

I am going to pick up donations almost every day of the week when I can. So far in the month of April, we have fed a little over 11,000 people. Thank you so much for all your support. You and your donations help provide all those things that go to the kits for families of needy kids at the school as well as snacks for those unable to provide one from home. We are also in great need of reusable GROCERY SIZE bags. These are used for people to put things like cereal and dry goods in. We have been getting a lot of new people, young college students and young couples. First timers do not know to bring their own bag so we provide one. We also use the grocery bags to pack meals for families. Please look around your home and see if you can part with any reusable grocery bags. Food Bank would love love to have them.

When you're out shopping and you would like to donate, our greatest need currently is canned chili and hot cereal.

Thank you, as always for all your support. It is appreciated more than you can ever imagine.




Facilitator: Rebekka Sollars, M.S.


