

The Psalmist writes, "Blessed are they whose ways are blameless, who walk according to the law of the Lord." [Ps 119:1]

In confirmation class you probably learned that the first use of the law is to curb bad behavior. When bad behavior is curbed, we are blessed. But it takes more than the law to curb bad behavior. It also takes law enforcement, because we do not naturally comply with the law. The fear of punishment encourages compliance with the law.

We are blessed when there is good law enforcement and lawbreakers are justly punished. That being said, we cannot police everyone all the time. For our world to be truly blessed with peace and justice, both internal and external controls must be in place. Law enforcement and punishment of bad behavior must be in place on the outside and the love of Jesus Christ must exist on the inside.

The love of Jesus, the love He has for us and the love He instills in us for Himself and

for one another, motivates us to control ourselves and to walk according to God's law. [2 Cor 5:14] Self-control is fruit of the Spirit. God has given us a spirit of power, love and self-control. [Gal 5:23, 2

Tim 1:7] Self-control is as essential to peace and justice as the external controls.





A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOODBANK

Food Bank is about to have some big changes. The current contract ended June 17. This means no more boxes of fresh produce weekly. We were able to procure boxes through the end of the month. In July, August, and part of September, we will be receiving nothing other than what we can pick up during the week from other donators. The new contract grant applications through WSDA opened yesterday and continues through July 17. We will be notified mid-August as to whether we are on the receiving end of one of those grants. We will be competing with large nonprofits like Food Lifeline, and Northwest harvest. Prayers welcomed. That contract, if we are awarded, probably won't start till mid-September. Therefore, your donations will be more needed than ever during those lean months. We will do the best we can to provide quality food even though the amount we provide will likely be less.

Although school is out and we will no longer be providing daily snacks for the kids, we will still be providing for vulnerable families over the summer. We are again very low on cold cereal. Kid friendly varieties like Froot Loops and Cinnamon Toast Crunch, while still vitamin fortified, are more expensive but attractive to kids. We also need pasta sauce, canned chili, and drinks. Small bottles or boxes of juice like apple or fruit punch would be a perfect alternative to soda for children, who are choosing for themselves during the day. We want to give them healthy options when making those choices. Also, we always welcome things like pop-top soups, easy Mac or cup-o-noodles. Microwavable meals that are safe and easy for kids to prepare.

Thank you as always for your continued support of the Food Bank. You make the difference. You may leave any donations in the box marked food bank in front of the church or inside down by the food bank door. Thanks everyone! We couldn't do it without you! Kim Petz.






