



Bettina, Katie, Josephine, and I wish everyone in the congregation a joyous Christmas season and a very blessed New Year!




JANUARY NEWS

2024-2025 registration will begin on Monday, February 5, 2024, and will be handled on a first come, first serve basis after current students. Current students will be automatically re-enrolled for the following year unless they age out or request not to re-enroll. Church members may register beginning on January 16, 2024.

If you, or someone you know who may be interested in our school please contact the preschool office at 425-255-8520 for more information. We are glad to give tours of our facility and answer any and all questions.

Our preschool is offered to all children 3-5 years of age. Our Kindergarten program is a half-day program for children who are five by August 31. We have a two-day-a-week session for three-year-olds, a three-day-a-week program for four-year-olds, and a five-day-a-week session for older four-year-olds. We also offer a Junior Kindergarten class for children who turn five between September 1, 2024, and December 31, 2024, and who show a readiness for an advanced preschool class. This class meets every morning, Monday through Friday.

Brochures for the 2024-2025 school year will be available mid-January and will be located at the Welcome Center in the Narthex.

selling authors, religious, cookbooks, & crafts just to name a few. If you do not see something you would like we can always submit a special request to the company.



Food Bank has been crazy as some of you will know. By the grace of God, we've been able to provide food for the community even without the funding. It's been difficult but we've been able to do it. We did have to close for the very first time in a really, really, long time on the Saturday after Thanksgiving. The donation place was closed. Therefore, we would've had no fresh food. It also gave volunteers a little rest, which they will deserve af-

ter continuing to be there every week. I appreciate them much more than they even know.

We also continue to do schools as well as families in the area that cannot come to Food Bank. The addition of the small room outside of the Food Bank has been extremely helpful. Thank you to all of those who helped put that together. I'm still looking for a few volunteers to come and help unload the truck. It would be an on-call situation since I never know if I'm getting anything or not that day. Mondays are especially needed. Please contact me if you are able to help.

Needed most are monetary donations to buy milk and eggs. Also needed is soup. Preferably with a pop top so it's easier for kids to open at home. We are also in need of things like laundry soap, bar soap, baby wipes, diapers, and dish soap.




