

<u>Message from the Food Bank</u>

In Food Bank news this week we had a very interesting helper. My Volunteer had not shown up and I was trying to load the van to deliver to a few families. I was struggling to get a few things into the van. Renton PD often uses our parking lot as most of you know as the visuals are good. They also train the canines in the ballfield. The officer came over and asked if I needed help. I accepted.

After helping me load the van he proceeded to come inside the Food Bank and move boxes for me. He then commented on how grateful he was for what we are doing for the community. He said you have no idea the impact you have on families in need saying that many are appreciative for what you are doing here. As the cost of food continues to rise, he had heard more and more new people are having to come to the Food Bank. Apparently, he knows someone who helps with another Food Bank, and they had told him this. And it's true. We are seeing more new people every week.

He also stated that he knows we have some repeats and greedy, but that is to be expected. I told him my philosophy is we are not the Food Bank police. No pun intended. If someone says they are hungry we will feed them. There is no way for you to know if they're getting it for someone else or for themselves. It could be for a friend, neighbor, brother, mother, sister, or anyone. He said that he does not work Saturday and has not actually seen Benson being blocked. He said he hopes that we all realize that what we are doing is vital, needed, and very appreciated. It was nice to know that others recognize our hard work and dedication to helping others in need.




