"The Non-Christmas, Christmas Story"

Vickie and I went to Barkley Cinemas last weekend to see the new movie, "The Man Who Invented Christmas". It was very entertaining. It's the semi-fictional story of how Charles Dickens penned *A Christmas Carol*. As I watched the movie, I was brought back to that familiar novella of Scrooge and Tiny Tim, the three ghosts, the transformation from a bankrupted worthless miser to a loving and generous human being. It's a great tale that warms the heart and lifts one's spirit; especially when Tiny Tim observes in the last sentence of the last page those iconic words: "God bless us, everyone". The book and the movie are worth the price of reading and watching.

But as I reflected on Dicken's creation, it struck me how we are drawn to the story: the wonderful power of transformation. It's about how a self-centered, selfish and worthless individual becomes a loving, happy and giving human being. The problem is that although the story takes place at Christmas, it has nothing to do with Christ.

At the core of this transformation story is Scrooge recognizing how lonely and miserable he truly is. Realizing that his future would be in eternal torment, he makes a deal with the Ghost of Christmas Future to turn his life around and become a better person. There is no faith or turning to Christ. It's all about being good enough.

Hear Scrooge as he makes his "confession":

"Good Spirit," he pursued, as down upon the ground he fell before it: "Your nature intercedes for me, and pities me. Assure me that I yet may change these shadows you have shown me, by an altered life!"

The kind hand trembled.

"I will honour Christmas in my heart, and try to keep it all the year. I will live in the Past, the Present, and the Future. The Spirits of all Three shall strive within me. I will not shut out the lessons that they teach. Oh, tell me I may sponge away the writing on this stone!"

"I will honor Christmas in my heart" is another way of saying that I'll sincerely act like I reflect the practices of the qualities that are expected at Christmas all year around. In other words: I'll change my behavior and that will save me from the miserable and fearful future.

Our natural inclination is to find ways around mentioning or acknowledging the centrality of Christ, which is the center and foundation of the celebration of Christmas itself. So many people desire the transformative power of love and happiness in their lives and if they can find some way of avoiding Jesus, they'll take it. They, and sometimes, we, pray to intermediaries: angels, saints, spirits of the dead, i.e., grandparents, loved-ones, etc. We'll make new year resolutions to be better persons. Better a bank of outside lights over our windows and doors than a single candle in the window symbolizing the light of Jesus.

From the beginning, *A Christmas Carol*, was a huge success. It had everything everybody wanted with no real substance. Now the bookstores, the Web and TV channels are being flooded with stories like "*A Wonderful Life*", where miracles happen without The One who made the miracle happen.

It's so easy to get caught up in the "love, grace and happy" feelings of Christmas and miss the mystery, wonder, true grace and joy of God coming as a person to live among us, die for us and live within each person who surrenders to Him through trusting in Jesus.

Christmas is a wonderful time of the year. It can be a bridge between the sacred and the secular: the truth and the fiction. Trees, tinsel, lights, gifts, secular Christmas music and even Dicken's *A Christmas Carol* can be a way to lead people to a new understanding of transformation and new life. But it will take willing people to be the light of Christ through our actions, our priorities, our words, grace, patience and love to our families, friends and neighbors.

Let us be very clear this Christmas season to whose God we pray and worship when we recite blessings like the last words of *A Christmas Carol*; "God bless us, everyone"


Thanks so much for the Composition graph paper notebooks received in the Meridian High School math department. They will be put to great use over the next few months.






