As all of us have witnessed in our country since March 15th

that things can change quickly and dramatically. Our safety and security have been torn away from us suddenly and now our world and nation are experiencing a global pandemic along with a plummeting financial market causing a broken economy. We are now living in very troubled times and walking through a sudden storm we were unprepared for.

Remember when Peter along with the other disciples were caught in a sudden storm out on the sea of Galilee "Buffeted by the waves, Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came toward Jesus. Someone You Should Know

"I was an only child with two sisters from my Mom's first marriage (her husband died). My Mom and Dad brought me into this world on December 14, 1959 when they were both approximately 45 years old. I was my Dad's only child. My early life was pretty normal, I did well in school and began playing the piano at the insistence of my mother at the age of 7. I am still playing today, over 50 years later.

Edith and I met over 15 years ago. We were married May 30th, 2015. We live in Oak Lawn with Derek (9), our nephew who is now living with us. He was born in Harlingen, TX.

I do have three sons from my first marriage, Dan (36), Eric (34) and Jacob (27). I also have a granddaughter, Kennedy (6), from Eric and Brandy. My son Dan is married to Bridget and living in Worth with their two dogs. Jacob is working with his brother Eric, currently in Europe, where they are doing Fiber Optic Engineering work. My parents are both deceased, Kennedy Thompson (died 2007), Mary Thompson (died 2004). My parents had a very strong and positive influence on my life. My mother was raised Catholic and my father, Mennonite. They came together in the Lutheran Church, which is where I was baptized as an infant and confirmed at the age of 14 (1974). It was during this process I was led to salvation by my pastor, Pastor Langrebe."

How did you discover the old Moraine Valley Community Church? What attracted you?

Edith and I discovered Moraine Valley Community Church one Sunday when we were searching for a church we could call home. We had gone to several churches in the area, both large and small, but just didn't connect with either the preaching or the people. We had actually planned to attend another church, but the service began at 10am, and we noticed that MVCC's service began at 11am. What we saw as an "accident" was actually God's plan all along. When we arrived that fateful Sunday at MVCC, we were greeted warmly by the members and we both remember sitting in the back row of the sanctuary at Savior Divine Lutheran Church (our host church building). As we left the building, I asked Edith what she thought and she replied, "we were home". We found a church that believed in teaching and preaching from the Bible. The music was uplifting and inspiring. At the end of the first service, Mark DeBauche (original drummer) came over to greet me and asked if I was a musician....not quite sure how he knew that, but he just smiled when I responded "Yes."

Are there any stories you would like to share? How did you come to know the Lord?

There are many stories that I would like to share, but I will share one very important story about my wife and how her faith and determination has truly guided me to be the Christian man I am today. I was pretty satisfied that my parents had done the right thing raising me as a Christian. I went to church every Sunday, was part of the youth group, attended my confirmation classes and ultimately became a member of the Lutheran Church back in 1974. I was also an acolyte at the Lutheran Church, I can share more of that later if someone wants to hear that story. My wife was raised Baptist and attended Christian schools during her entire formal education process, but she impressed me so much with her knowledge of the Bible and how the Word of God impacted her throughout her life. It was this inspiration and how God brought us together, two broken people, who truly wanted to do the right things going forward, that I decided to be baptized as an adult at Moraine Valley Community Church. I did give my life to Jesus at the age of 14, but I truly renewed that vow, when I was baptized as

an adult. I was baptized on the same day as Noah Juarez. It was a very special day and I have never looked back. Jesus is my Savior and my guiding light through this world as I continue to work to be the best Christian husband, father and leader that I can be with God's help.

What advice would you like to give our younger generation?

Begin early in your life to focus on God's Will, God's Way and God's Time. It is truly not about you; it is about

God. Serve God, honor God, Glorify God and you will be on the best path in Life. To be a true follower of Christ, learn to sacrifice those things that you want and focus on the needs of others.

And last but certainly not least, how would you like this story to end? Any quotes or wisdom you can share?



In Jesus' Name, Amen.


