- 20 filled backpacks were purchased and brought to the pantry from Elsie's daughter Jacquelyn Pyle, as well as multiple supplies donated from a drive in Hickory Hills.
- Monetary donations as well as a grant from the Greater Chicago Food Depository were used to purchase a brand new 2-door freezer. We now have 2 industrial freezer as well as one large freezer.
- We are still averaging 70-75 families each week.
- 100 turkeys and 100 hams, turkeys and turkey breasts are being donated for Thanksgiving and Christmas this year from the GCFD.

It has been another amazing year, we are "21" in 2021!
