"What we have heard and known, what our fathers have told us, we will not hide them from our children, we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, about his power, and about the wonders he has done." Psalm 78:3-4

With all the students back in school summer has officially come to a close for this year. Summer often is a time in youth ministry where attendance is low and the schedule is empty but that was not our case this year! Living Faith youth continued to meet weekly with numbers often similar to our school year and we were able to successfully hold two large events this summer that were enjoyed by many.

Our first event this summer was our annual 5 Day Club in partnership with Child Evangelism Fellowship. In the weeks leading up to our club I was informed that multiple families were going to be out of town for the week or had other conflicts. Honestly, I started to get nervous about how many kids we were going to have. But like always I was surprised at who God brought to club that week. We had an average 8-10 students each day and a couple of them were new to our group. During club I witnessed students really lean into the lessons and missionary stories and gain a new understanding of what they were learning. On top of new Biblical knowledge and growth in their faith, the students also grew closer together as a group. At the end of the week we had students that started out shy and reserved jumping right in to play games and answer questions and other students tell me at the bonfire that they now considered this group some of their close friends. Both the spiritual growth and deepening of friendships within the group made this one of my favorite weeks of the summer.

Our second big event was packing shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child. The idea to

move this event from it's normal time frame in November to July/August came as a way to free up time during the holidays, but I think it also made it possible for this to be our best year ever. The youth and adults came together on two Thursdays to pack over 50 boxes with gifts that will later this year be shipped around the world. Thanks to generous donations we were able to include many necessary items in each box like a tooth brush, socks, combs, soap and wash cloths; as well as fun gifts such as coloring books, crayons, Barbie dolls, stuffed animals, craft supplies, footballs, race cars and way more! The beauty of these boxes is that they not only are a treasured gift for the child but also used as a tool to share the gospel message of salvation with them. We are praying that the children that receive these boxes will also receive Jesus in their lives. Although we filled all our shoe boxes there is still a financial need for us to help get these boxes on their journey. Operation Christmas Child recommends a \$10 donation/box to help cover the shipping cost of getting these boxes to their child. We would love to try and cover as much of that as we can for the boxes we packed so if you feel led to give in any way please let me know.

The end of summer can bring mixed feelings as school starts back up and the weather changes but as I look back at the summer, I can only be thankful for all that happened within Living Faith Youth Group. God doesn't care if it is winter or summer; He continues His work just the same and for that I am thankful.
