We can see in the real-life story of Mary and Joseph as recorded in the Gospel of Luke chapter 2 that this young couple had a lot on their minds too and were facing very difficult challenges that significant week. Joseph had to lead Mary on a donkey cross country to register his family in his ancient hometown of David because of an empire wide Roman census right at the time when his young wife Mary was 9 months pregnant and expecting any day. Imagine now on top of that kind of stress, when they did arrive in Bethlehem, Joseph could not find a room for his beloved Mary, and it was starting to get dark and cold real fast. Joseph had to go into hero mode. This Christ centered, destiny driven, prophesy fulfilling couple understood stress and busyness.

After giving birth to God's son, Mary and Joseph began to experience the presence of God and heard stories of angels as local shepherd began showing up and telling of heavenly host singing about this very night that Christ was born. It



says in the text "All who heard about it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them concerning this child." (v. 18) Now at this point in the account it says something very significant "But Mary treasured up all these things told to her and pondered them in her heart." (v.19) This response is the true meaning and spirit of Christmas – remembering the preciousness of this moment when God's son Christ was born.

Dear ones this is what's truly important for us too. After everything this young couple had

gone through leading up to this historical night, when the moment finally arrived, Mary understood in her heart that Jesus God's own son had come into the world in the package of this little Hebrew baby with eternity shining in his eyes. My hope for all of us this Christmas, maybe more than ever before, that we would capture the specialness of Christ birth in our hearts, and ponder it, and treasure it. Try to slow down and come and worship with us at Living Faith celebrating Christ birth. I pray that when at home this year with your family you will tell your children the story of Jesus birth and help them to understand the true wonder and meaning of Christmas.

Bible Study

Ezekiel's Connection to Us Today

Upon reading the Old Testament, one thing that you will find very clear, if you choose to study it, is how it, particularly as a history, resonates with and connects to us today. What do I mean by that? A number of years ago, the Holy Spirit showed me how living in a post Christian world is really a return to the ancient order of things. In seeing things in that light, so many more things begin to make sense, particularly when you study prophecy and where things are going as we move further in the end times.

Ezekiel's Calling:

Ezekiel was the son of a Priest in Jerusalem, raised to become a Priest himself, but the calling that he was preparing for his whole life was disrupted when the Babylonians invaded Jerusalem and Judah a second time, causing him to be exiled in Babylon. In Babylon, God revealed His glory to Ezekiel by the River Chebar and commissioned Ezekiel to preach repentance to a nation that for years didn't care about what God had to say, hardened their hearts to Him, His Word, His chances to turn back to Him, and His warnings, and were exiled as a punishment for their sins, which were exceedingly great (Ezekiel 9:9). Despite their rebellious state, God in His grace commissioned Ezekiel to give the exiles another chance (something God frequently does with us today) to repent and be a part of the great plans He has for His people, should they choose to submit to Him and want to take part in His plan.

When Ezekiel's status was changed from "priest" to "prophet", a calling that did not have the fringe benefits, nor the prestige and honor that normally came to a priest in that time period, Ezekiel's place in world history would be determined by how he simply obeyed what God had commanded him to do, be where God called him to be, and do things (that would have great symbolic meaning) that would cause Ezekiel to connect with God emotionally, and get people to ponder on the actions that were observed.

Today our culture/environment has many striking similarities with the culture/environment of the 6th century B.C. In the book of Jeremiah, we see in deep, meticulous detail, what caused great offenses to God to the extent that they aroused His anger and provoked His wrath upon them, using the Babylonians as His instrument for judgment. As Jeremiah continues to focus on matters where he is geographically (Judah), the book of Ezekiel branches off and begins in Babylon, amid a community of exiles, where Ezekiel now lives, and must serve as an instrument to God's message of repentance, hope, and bright future prospects for face further judgment, condemnation, and feel His hand work against them because of their sin, pride, hardened hearts, and rebellion.

Where this leads for us today:

Since the Bible is indeed a history book, we need to come to terms with the fact that modern day equivalents to these ancient behaviors that made God so angry in the 6th century B.C. are once again resurfacing exponentially on a global scale as we move further and further away from God. What's fascinating to see is that God still exists, and the Bible shows us how He feels about things, what makes Him happy, and reveals to us what will arouse His wrath globally (via the Book of Revelation). All we have to do is discern them, care about them, and obey God as He commissions us to bring the Gospel message of Jesus Christ to the whole world.

What I also find fascinating is that in God's grace, He made it so much easier for us to turn to Him by simply believing and trusting in His Son, Jesus Christ to bring us in the presence of God and fulfill the very things that God's own people could never do. This is why the gift of Jesus is so powerful and important to ponder on, particularly as we celebrate the Christmas season. And we are privileged to be reconciled with God because of Jesus and have a living relationship with Him. That gives us an edge today that many in the ancient times did not have. In that, God also made it easier for us to have immeasurable access to the Holy Spirit, who reveals truth and provides us with a well-rounded view of where we are personally, where the world is

culturally and morally, where God is (and how He still feels) in all of this, and the direction that everything is headed, which happens to be exactly what God revealed to us in His Word in advance.

So, I invite you to join us on Thursdays at 7pm to look at all of these dynamics interchangeably and in rich detail, as we thoroughly study the book of Ezekiel and what it means for us today. And I also invite you to take in the previously posted podcasts of our series on Jeremiah, accessible through the top of the homepage under "Bible Study (Podcasts)" at


<u>Líving Faith Youth Group</u>

I can envision one day having another Elsie's Pantry in our church. Maybe someday, God willing. Elsie's Daughter, Jacquelyn Pyle and her group called Compassion and Justice donated \$500 worth of dog and cat food and treats in November. Not only were the animals happy in November, so were their owners. The Greater Chicago Food Depository gave us 80 turkeys and 45 hams for Thanksgiving along with stuffing, potatoes, onion, canned vegetables and fruit. 197 Families were served that day. We opened an hour early so we wouldn't have a five-block backup like last Thanksgiving. On December 22nd we anticipate the same amount of families coming for their Christmas hams and turkeys, and we are ready for that. Please pray that the Lord continues to provide the means to serve those in need for the next 23 years! Thank you all for your prayers and support.


