The holiday season can be exhausting. It is a busy time. We place so many expectations on ourselves and others to make everything, "just right." The holidays can be an emotional time as well. We celebrate with friends and families, yet we may be grieving loved ones we have lost. When we finally get to Christmas day, the word that hits me is "weary." That word, "weary" always reminds me of the Christmas carol, "O Holy Night." These are a few of my favorite lines:

"A thrill of hope the weary world rejoices. For yonder breaks a new and glorious morn. Fall on your knees; O hear the Angles voices! O night divine, O night when Christ was born."

The carol reminds me that God did something new on that first Christmas day. God became incarnate. God lowered God's self to human form and walked among us. 


#### WHAT GOES UP MUST COME DOWN!
