The Fourth Sunday of Easter



Welcome to Worship! Today is known on the Church Calendar as "Good Shepherd Sunday," and the readings and hymns serve up a shepherd's heart for his sheep. The Introit uses some wordplay to make a point: instead of saying we are the *sheep* of His pasture, the psalmist implies that we are *like* sheep by saying we are the *people* of His pasture. The reading from Acts is a picture of God's flock hanging together by holding their faith and their possessions in common. In the Epistle, Peter says we were straying like sheep, but now have been returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of our souls. In the Gospel Jesus calls Himself the door for the sheep.

The hymns we sing today are among most people's favorites, because they use pastoral images of a shepherd's love and care for His sheep. Good Shepherd Sunday is a great day to worship and praise the Lamb who laid down His life for His sheep!





P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the tenth chapter.



¹[Jesus said:] "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door but climbs in by another way, that man is a thief and a robber. ²But he who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep. ³To him the gatekeeper opens. The sheep hear his voice, and he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. ⁴When he has brought out all his own, he goes before them, and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice. ⁵A stranger they will not follow, but they will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of strangers." ⁶This figure of speech Jesus used with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

⁷So Jesus again said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep. ⁸All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. ⁹I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture. ¹⁰The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly."


