- **P:** The Third Article [SANCTIFICATION] I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen. What does this mean?
- C: I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.

Welcome to Worship! "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us...." Today's readings remind us that God's Christmas gift is more than just a wish and greater than an idea. Jesus, the Son of God, is heavenly wisdom incarnate in real flesh and blood just like ours! In the Old Testament reading, Solomon asks God for wisdom, and God grants it to him. In the Gospel, however, One who is greater than Solomon has no need to ask God for wisdom, because "all who heard Him were amazed at His understanding and His answers!" In the Epistle Paul enumerates the gifts this all wise God-in-the-flesh brings: "redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace, which He lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight."
