The Baptism of Our Lord

01-10-2021

Welcome to Worship! Today we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord, and the readings all carry the images of water and the Spirit. In the Genesis reading, the Spirit of God hovers over the face of the waters. The Gospel is the account of Jesus' baptism where the Spirit descends on Him like a dove. In today's Epistle, Paul speaks of baptism as the power for Christians to walk in Spirit-filled newness of life.

The hymns reflect the same image as well. In the Hymn of the Day, "To Jordan's River Came Our Lord," we sing, "The Holy Spirit, heavenly dove, descended on Him from above." In the Sending Hymn, we sing of the blessings that come from the Holy Spirit being present with the water and the Word. In the Hymn of Invocation, we sing about the completion of our Baptism with water and the Spirit: "Until the day that you possess, the glorious crown of righteousness."


Remove the Holy Spirit from the water of Baptism and reduce Baptism to a believer's commitment to God, and suddenly, uncertainty arises: Was I sincere enough when I was baptized? Did God accept my pledge of faith when I was baptized? Did I even realize what I was getting into, or Who I was getting involved with when I was baptized? The answers to all of those questions are debatable, and ultimately, unknown. But when the Spirit of God is in, with, and under the waters of Baptism, I can safely say, "Even though I may have no recollection of my personal involvement in Baptism, I know that the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of Life, was there with the water, giving me faith and whatever else might be necessary to be baptized." That being the case, I need have no doubts about whether what God has done in Baptism has "worked" in my life. That's God's concern. My regard is to rest in the faith that whatever God does is always dependable and certain!

Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper in which He feeds us with His body and blood. The Lutheran Church recognizes the real presence of the body and blood of Christ in this Sacrament, and we ask all who attend the Sacrament to share this faith with us. Members of our sister congregations in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are welcome to commune. **If you are a guest and want to receive the Sacrament, please speak with the pastor or an elder before the Service prior to communing.** Please indicate your attendance at communion by signing the communion registration sheet on the desk by the outer door. At the center of the communion tray, there are glasses with a reduced amount of wine for those who don't wish to have as much wine when they commune. **Please speak to the pastor before the service if you wish to receive a gluten-free communion wafer.**



How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

Mark 1:4–11

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the first chapter.

Nicene Creed

C I believe in one God,

the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ. the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man: and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. AS THE HEAD OF THE FAMILY SHOULD TEACH IT IN A SIMPLE WAY TO HIS HOUSEHOLD


- P: <u>The Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer</u> Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. What does this mean?



 For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.


The Words of Our Lord


