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## The Third Sunday of Easter

April 18, 2021

**Welcome to Worship!** Today's worship focuses on the joy that is ours as followers of Jesus. In the Introit, we say, "In your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore." The collect asks God to give His faithful people "perpetual gladness and eternal joys." In the reading from Acts, we come upon a formerly lame man who in the verses before, was "walking and leaping and praising God" for joy at his healing. In the Gospel, the disciples "disbelieved for joy" at seeing Jesus. The Epistle speaks of the reason for our joy: "See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are!"

**Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper** in which He feeds us with His body and blood. The Lutheran Church recognizes the real presence of the body and blood of Christ in this Sacrament, and we ask all who attend the Sacrament to share this faith with us. Members of our sister congregations in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are welcome to commune. **If you are a guest and want to receive the Sacrament, please speak with the pastor or an elder before the Service prior to communing.** If you wish to receive the common cup instead of an individual glass, place your hand across your chest. At the center of the communion tray, there are glasses with a reduced amount of wine for those who don't wish to have as much wine when they commune. Please indicate your attendance at communion by signing the communion registration sheet on the desk by the outer door. **We now have gluten-free communion wafers for those who need them. To signal pastor that you prefer the gluten-free wafer, please put up two fingers (like the peace sign) as the wafers are being distributed.**

*Acts 3:11–21*




### Proper Preface (Full)

### Proclamation of Christ

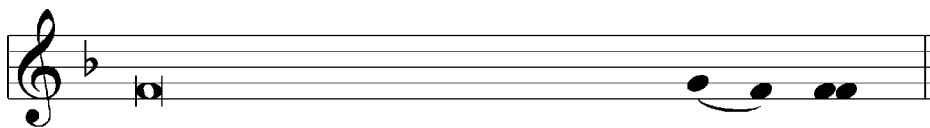
- P As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

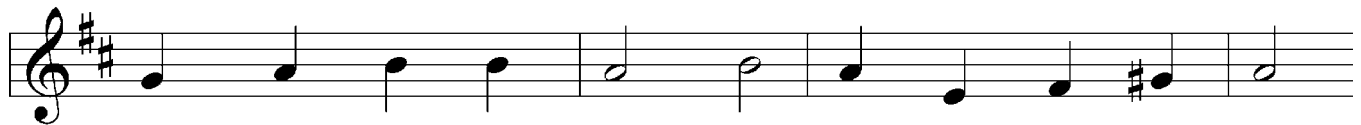

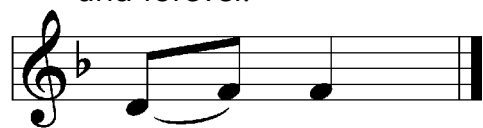

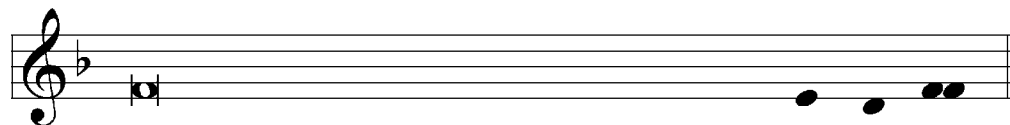
