Welcome to Worship! Today's readings show us faithful servants of God who were hindered in their work for the Lord, yet they remained faithful. Ezekiel is sent to the rebellious nation of Israel, aware that the Israelites might well ignore him or persecute him. In the Epistle, Paul is harassed by a messenger of Satan. In the Gospel, even Jesus' gracious intentions were hampered by His unbelieving neighbors. The introit tells us where to find relief from hindrances: Blessed is the man who takes refuge in the Lord!
