#### The Fifth Sunday after Epiphany\_

February 6, 2022

**Welcome to worship!** Isaiah "saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up." He was overcome with an awareness of his sin and "unclean lips," but the Lord atoned for his sin, took away his guilt and sanctified his lips with a burning coal from the altar. After being forgiven, he was called and sent as a prophet of the Lord's Word. In the same way, when Simon Peter and his companions "enclosed a large number of fish," he, too, was overcome with an awareness of his sin and said, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man." Jesus, however, comforted Simon, called him to discipleship, and declared that he would be "catching men." Like that boat in the Gospel where Jesus taught, the Church remains the place today where Jesus still teaches His people. The preaching of Christ Jesus is still a manifestation of the Holy Spirit, where the epistle says He continues to build up His Church on earth.

**Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper** in which He feeds us with His body and blood. The Lutheran Church recognizes the real presence of the body and blood of Christ in this Sacrament, and we ask all who attend the Sacrament to share this faith with us. Members of our sister congregations in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are welcome to commune. **If you are a guest and want to receive the Sacrament, please speak with the pastor or an elder before the Service prior to communing.** 

If you wish to receive the common cup instead of an individual glass, place your hand across your chest. At the center of the communion tray, there are glasses with a reduced amount of wine for those who don't wish to have as much wine when they commune. Please indicate your attendance at communion by signing the communion registration sheet on the desk by the outer door.


We have gluten-free communion wafers for those who need them. Please speak to the pastor prior to the service if you wish to receive them.

And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. <sup>4</sup>And when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." <sup>5</sup>And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." <sup>6</sup>And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking. <sup>7</sup>They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. <sup>8</sup>But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." <sup>9</sup>For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, <sup>10</sup>and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." <sup>11</sup>And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.

- P In the morning when you get up, make the sign of the holy cross and say:
- C In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- P Then, kneeling or standing, repeat the Creed and the Lord's Prayer. If you choose, you may also say this little prayer:
- I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.
- P Then go joyfully to your work, singing a hymn, like that of the Ten Commandments, or whatever your devotion may suggest.





blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."


#### **Proclamation of Christ**






