The Transfiguration of our Lord

February 27, 2022

Welcome to Worship Today's readings reveal that although Moses was the greatest prophet of the Old Testament, Jesus takes the center stage in God's kingdom. The Old Testament reading states, "There has not arisen a prophet since in Israel like Moses, whom the Lord knew face to face." The author of Hebrews says: "Jesus has been counted worthy of *more* glory than Moses." In today's Gospel the Father directs the disciples' attention away from Moses and Elijah and says, "This is My Son—listen to *Him!*"

The hymns follow that theme as well. In "'Tis Good, Lord, to be Here," the hymn writer pictures Moses and Elijah standing in the glory that emanates from Jesus. The Hymn of the Day reminds us that not even the sun can radiate the glory that comes from Jesus. In the Sending Hymn we sing that Jesus is the "Light of Light." Transfiguration Sunday, the culmination of Epiphany, reveals a shining, glorious Jesus, who is truly God. Soak in His glory today, and let it carry you down the mountain and back into your everyday life!

Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper in which He feeds us with His body and blood. The Lutheran Church recognizes the real presence of the body and blood of Christ in this Sacrament, and we ask all who attend the Sacrament to share this faith with us. Members of our sister congregations in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are welcome to commune. **If you are a guest and want to receive the Sacrament, please speak with the pastor or an elder before the Service prior to communing.**

If you wish to receive the common cup instead of an individual glass, place your hand across your chest. At the center of the communion tray, there are glasses with a reduced amount of wine for those who don't wish to have as much wine when they commune. Please indicate your attendance at communion by signing the communion registration sheet on the desk by the outer door.

We have gluten free communion wafers for those who need them. Please speak to the pastor prior to the service if you wish to receive them.

Old Testament Reading

Deuteronomy 34:1–12

¹Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho. And the LORD showed him all the land, Gilead as far as Dan, ²all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the western sea, ³the Negeb, and the Plain, that is, the Valley of Jericho the city of palm trees, as far as Zoar. ⁴And the LORD said to him, "This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, 'I will give it to your offspring.' I have let you see it with your eyes, but you shall not go over there." ⁵So Moses the servant of the LORD died there in the land of Moab, according to the word of the LORD, ⁶and he buried him in the valley in the land of Moab opposite Beth-peor; but no one knows the place of his burial to this day. ⁷Moses was 120 years old when he died. His eye was undimmed, and his vigor unabated. ⁸And the people of Israel wept for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days. Then the days of weeping and mourning for Moses were ended.

⁹And Joshua the son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, for Moses had laid his hands on him. So the people of Israel obeyed him and did as the LORD had commanded Moses. ¹⁰And there has not arisen a prophet since in Israel like Moses, whom the LORD knew face to face, ¹¹none like him for all the signs and the wonders that the LORD sent him to do in the land of Egypt, to Pharaoh and to all his servants and to all his land, ¹²and for all the mighty power and all the great deeds of terror that Moses did in the sight of all Israel.
