The Catechism The Ten Commandments AS THE HEAD OF THE FAMILY SHOULD TEACH THEM IN A SIMPLE WAY TO HIS HOUSEHOLD

- The Ninth Commandment You shall not covet your neighbor's house. What does this mean?
- We should fear and love God so that we do not scheme to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, or get it in a way which only appears right, but help and be of service to him in keeping it.
- The Tenth Commandment You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor. What does this mean?
- We should fear and love God so that we do not entice or force away our neighbor's wife, workers, or animals, or turn them against him, but urge them to stay and do their duty.

THE PRAYER OF THE WEEK:

Almighty and everlasting God, You have given us grace to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity by the confession of a true faith and to worship the Unity in the power of the Divine Majesty. Keep us steadfast in this faith and defend us from all adversities; for You, O Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, live and reign, one God, now and forever.

Welcome to Worship! On Trinity Sunday, our worship abounds with references to the Trinity. From beginning our worship in the name of the Trinity to concluding with three mentions of "the LORD," God's triune nature is the focus of our hymns and readings. The Old Testament reading brings to mind Jesus as Wisdom Incarnate, creating the world with His Father and the Holy Spirit. In the reading from Acts, we hear Peter refer to all three persons of the Trinity: "This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing." In the Gospel, lesus incurs the wrath of the lewish leaders when He identifies Himself as a person of the Trinity. Although the Bible never specifically uses the word "trinity," it is apparent that numerous Bible verses refer to God as one, while other verses identify Him as three, and even name the persons of the Trinity. The Trinity is a Biblical doctrine that we believe, even though it is above human logic. Thank God that even though the Trinity may be beyond our understanding, it is not beyond our experience!
