The Apostles' Creed AS THE HEAD OF THE FAMILY SHOULD TEACH IT IN A SIMPLE WAY TO HIS HOUSEHOLD

The Second Article [redemption] I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead. What does this mean?

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.

The Prayer of the Week

Almighty God, You have built Your Church on the foundation of the apostles and prophets with Christ Jesus Himself as the cornerstone. Continue to send Your messengers to preserve Your people in true peace that, by the preaching of Your Word, Your Church may be kept free from all harm and danger; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Welcome to Worship! Today's readings are filled with thoughts about a message and messengers. In the Introit, the heavens, the sky, and day and night are messengers of God's glory. Their "words" goes out into all the world, but they are not specific enough to give saving knowledge of Jesus. The Old Testament reading from Isaiah is the heart of this message: there is peace, comfort, rejoicing, and the ability to flourish because God has redeemed us. In the Gospel, Jesus sends out seventy-two messengers with that message of Good News, and when they return to share what happened with Jesus, He replies, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven." Because the message of the cross has such power to change hearts, Paul says in the Epistle: "Far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ." The Gradual sums up the theme of the day: "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news, who publish peace and bring good news of salvation."
